REAGAN: "FRIENDS SOMETIMES HAVE ARGUMENTS"

WASHINGTON (WNS) -- The Reagan Administration seemed to be moving toward reconciliation with Israel following the rift that developed with Israel's annexation of the Golan Heights. The U.S. suspended the strategic cooperation agreement after the annexation move and Premier Menachem Begin unleashed an unprecedented attack on U.S. policies toward Israel two days later.

But, through indications from various Administration officials here, the rhetoric has simmered and the two nations are reported to be in communication with one another as to the future of the memorandum of understanding on strategic cooperation. President Reagan said of the recent rift between the two nations that "Friends sometimes have arguments and I guess this is one." This position, apparently an attempt to cool the tension, was echoed through the week by the Administration.

Appearing on CBS-TV "Face the Nation" pro-

The View From Golan Heights

In the course of President Reagan's recent press conference, he was asked several pointed questions about Prime Minister Begin's unexpected move on the Golan Heights.

Given Syria's record of bombarding the Israeli farms (beneath the Golan Heights) do you believe the Heights should be returned to Syria, one of the reporters inquired. Diplomatically, the President demurred: the question raised cannot be separated from the broader question of transfer of considerable territory now being negotiated, he said in effect.

But then came a second question: "To follow that up, your own opinion -- did you ever object to the Arab Legion's occupation of the West Bank or the shelling of the Israeli farms?"

"Well, that's going back a long way, and it's hard for me to remember what my position was," the President replied. "I know where I was during the Six-Day-War: I was in the Hollywood Bowl at a mass meeting in support of Israel."

This spontaneous exchange illustrates why we have to take such pains to keep deeply-rooted, thorny Arab-Israeli relations in historical perspective. As Mr. Reagan said the Syrian shelling of Israeli farms goes back a long way. And so does the settlement of Jews in the Biblical city of Golan -- some 2000 years. So does the purchase of Golan Heights land for settlement of Jewish settlers by Baron Edmond de Rothschild -- in 1894.

But history is a stern master. And the people who now shape foreign policy in Washington need to keep in mind that the Jews of troubled Palestine have had the martial shadow of Golan Heights hanging over them ever since England and France, having had it in their power after World
