UN AMBASSADOR GIVES "60 minutes" interview

NEW YORK (WNS) -- Jeane Kirkpatrick, United States Ambassador to the United Nations said in an interview on CBS-TV's "60 Minutes" program that there has "been some concernexpressed about Jewish influence within our (U.S.) mission" and about Jewish influence on United States policy. Kirkpatrick said that this concern has been expressed by "other delegations" at the United Nations.

"I think there's a certain amount of concern about the, I know there is, about the number of Jews in the U.S. mission under this administration, in policy making position," the Ambassador said in the television interview with CBS correspondent Mike Wallace. "I know there is because I've heard a good deal of whispers about it. And reported to me...." Asked whether this was from other delegations, Kirkpatrick replied, "From other delegations, yes."
