TEL AVIV (WNS) -- A student exchange program between Egypt and Israel began with the arrival of 60 Egyptian high school students. A similar group of Israeli students is scheduled to visit Egypt in February. Jalam Alam, director general of Egypt's Supreme Youth Council, told reporters at Ben Gurion Airport, that the program will "give the young people of both countries the opportunity to discuss how people in this region can live in peace."

UNITED NATIONS (WNS) -- Secretary General Javier Perez de Cueller, of Peru, who replaced Kurt Waldheim, said recently that as Secretary General he will maintain "great interest in the Mideast" and its problems. Speaking at his first press conference since response to questions that he does not intend, at this time, to send any emissary to the Mideast to explore the situation there. "The time is not ripe for such a mission," he said.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- An Army spokesman said that there was absolutely no truth to a report by the United Nations Interim Force in Lebanon (UNIFIL) that Israel carried out military maneuvers using live ammunition on Lebanese soil. According to a UNIFIL spokes-man, Israeli troops were involved in the exercise in the Yarin and Marwahin areas of Lebanon, about a mile from the Israeli border.

NEW YORK (W S) -- The Jewish Identity Center, an activist organization which has long focused on the rise of anti - Semitism in the United States and its ominous threat to American Jews announced the opening of a permanent exhibit on anti - Semitism soon to be housed in New York City.
