MAHLON BROWN RUNS FOR ATTORNEY GENERAL

B. Mahlon Brown, III, former U.S. Attorney for Nevada, has announced he will be a Democratic Candidate for Attorney General. "I am seeking the office of Attorney General because of my vast experience in law, administration and law enforcement," said Brown. A former Justice of the Peace in Las

Vegas, Brown said the cornerstone of his campaign will focus on the "ever-increasing" crime rate which has plagued Nevada in recent years.

"I will not only serve as legal advisor to state departments and agencies, but I plan to use the powers of the office to help stem the ever increasing crime rate in our state," said Brown.

During his four years as United States Attorney, Brown drew high marks for his vigorous pursuit of prosecution and conviction of criminal elements involved in political corruption and high level drug trafficking.

"Our staff was one of the most highly respected and recognized in the country," said Brown. "We brought a new visibility and respect to the office by going into areas which previously had been ignored."

This pursuit resulted in major convictions for three of the two largest narcotics cases in the United States during the past two years, including one of the largest suppliers of PCP in the nation; one of the top ten

cocaine distributors in the country; and the largest hashish smuggler in the United States.

Brown was born and raised in Las Vegas and following graduation from Las Vegas High School, he attended the University of Nevada, Reno for two years before transferring to George Washington University where he received his Bachelor's degree.

He attended Howard University in Washington, D. C. where he received his Juris Doctor degree.

His father, B. Mahlon Brown, Jr. is a former Nevada State Senator who holds the distinction of serving in the Senate for the longest period in the state's history.

Brown, the father of three children, is active in all sports and enjoys music, travel, reading and antique collecting.

He received the Good Fellow Award from the City of Hope in 1975 and is a member of the American Bar Assn., Nevada Bar Assn., Clark County Bar Assn., Washoe County Bar Assn., American Judicature Society and the Federal Bar of Nevada.

TRAVELER'S CHECKS ABROAD

Is there a best way to take money on a foreign trip? YES - traveler's checks for two important reasons: safety and convertibility.

You don't stand any loss if the checks are lost or stolen and you can readily obtain local currency in exchange for traveler's checks at just about any stop on your route from airport, to hotel to small shop.

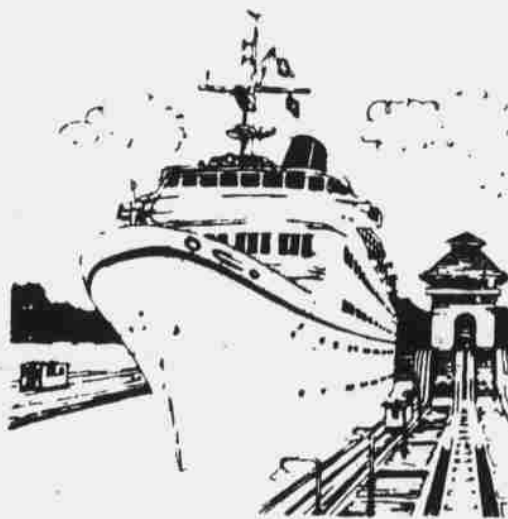
Traveler's checks must be signed by you in the presence of the person cashing them - and your signature must match the one you wrote at the time you bought the checks. The cost of the checks is about one percent of the purchase (\$1 for \$100 worth of checks).

Abroad, it's best to cash your traveler's checks at a bank or a branch office of the issuing organization. Banks usually stick to the official exchange rate and don't charge you for converting into local currency; or at least, a very nominal fee. Some shops and hotels charge a service fee for cashing checks and some airport counters are known to be competitive with local banks.
