race, president chief executive Grace. and officer of W.R.Grace & Co., was appointed as chairman of the Private Sector Sur-vey on Coast Control in Federal Government. Both Grace and his corporation, an international chemical concern, have confirmed ties with Otto Ambros who was a director of the I.G. Farben Chemical Co. in Germany during World War II and is now a consultant to W. R. Grace. For his role in establishing a Farben works at Auschwitz, Ambros was convicted in Nuremberg of slavery and mass murder. He was sentenced to eight years imprisonment but served less than three years and was reportedly helped by Grace to enter . the U.S.

Lantos a sent telegram to the President on March 8 in which he stated: "having shared with you in the White House a most somber cereremembering mony the nightmare of the Holocaust: having belief in your fundamental decency in your commitment to human rights, it is inconceivable to me that

WE WON'T ATTACK"

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- President Reagan's special envoy to the Middle East, Philip Habib, continued his round of shuttle diplomacy in an effort to preserve the cease-fire along the Is-raeli - Lebanese border which he helped establish last July and according to his assessment of the situation, all parties in the area want the cease - fire to remain intact.

Habib met with Premier Menachem Begin, Foreign Minister Yitzhak Shamir and Defense Minister Ariel Sharon in Jerusalem after having visited Lebanon, Syria, Saudi Arabia and Jordan. Israeli sources said Shamir told Habib that Israel was interested in a solution to the fundamental problems of Lebanon but would do nothing to change the situation or effect a solution as long as the present cease-fire exists.

This was an apparent attempt to thwart growing concern that Israel intends to invade southern Lebanon. But Israeli officials were clear in pointing out that they would react swiftly to an attack from Palestinian Liberation Organization forces in the area. The government has been feeding the media lately with reports of a major military arms buildup by the PLO since the cease - fire went into effect and at the same time have accused the terrorist organization of numerous violations of the ceasefire including an aborted infiltration of the West Bank via Syria and Jordan.

Sharon, interviewed on the ABC-TV "This Week With David Brinkley" program denied that Israel intends to attack Lebanon but warned that it has a "natural right" to defend its citizens. "Israel is looking for a peaceful solution in Le-
