NEW YORK (WNS) -- Jewish activists in Leningrad have been warned by Soviet authorities that no more than six persons may gather in any private home for a Passover seder, it was reported here by the Student Struggle for Soviet Jewry and the Union of Councils for Soviet Jews.


EWISH NEWS BRIEFS

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- The Cameri Theater has appealed to the Supreme Court against a ban by the censors that could prevent the performance of its latest production, "The Great Harlot of Babylon," The censorship board, known officially as the Public Council for Criticism of Motion Pictures and Plays, approved the play by Israeli writer Hanock Levin but objected to full nudity called for in the script.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Some 400 representa-tives from all over the world including the United States, Europe, Armenia, Biafra, Japan, and Tibet, will attend a workshop and conference on the Holocaust and genocide, to be held in Jerusalem and Tel Aviv in June. Conference chairman Prof. Israel Charney, of Tel Aviv University, and conference co - director Prof. Shamai Davidson, of Bar Ilan University, said the aim of the conference was to foster understanding of the roots and implementation of genocide in order to intervene in time to prevent it.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Australian Foreign Minister Anthony Street wound up a four day visit to Israel by calling for a "Palestinian homeland along side Israel." He declined to specify how this was to be achieved. Street was cautious in his comments on the West Bank disturbances, expressing "concern" at the "un-happy events," He said they had "not been helpful in making progress toward a settlement of the Palestinian issue, the central, crucial issue" of the Mideast conflict.

NEW YORK (WNS) --- The United Jewish Appeal collected more than \$301 million in 1981 -- a peacetime record -- to help provide humanitarian programs and services to Jews in need in Israel and worldwide, Edgar Cadden, UJA national cash chairman, announced January 18. He described the record campaign total as "a watermark for Jewish humanitarian efforts in this country.

FORT WAYNE, IND. (WNS) -- A Fort Wayne Jewish Federation executive reported that the city's Jewish community of 1,350 largely escaped major damage from the recent flooding that caused an estimated \$20 million in damages here. Eli Akora, Federation executive director, said that the 9,000 Fort Wayne residents who were evacuated at the peak of the flood and who were given an "all clear" signal by Mayor Winfield Moses, Jr., to return to their homes, including no more than five Jewish families.

AMSTERDAM (WNS) -- Foreign Minister Max van der Stoel was presented with a petition on behalf of Soviet Jewry bearing 900,000 signatures collected in Holland. The presentation was made by Rabbi Avraham Soetendorp, as chairman of the Dutch Solidarity Committee with Soviet Jewry. The signatures were collected at churches, in schools and in public buildings.
