BEGIN CALLS FOR HOUSE WHITE WASH WHITE SPECIAL ISRAEL

The ugly charge of dual loyalty aimed at the American Jewish community which surfaced during lost year's heated debate over the sale of AWACS reconnaissance planes to Saudi Arabia, was brought back from the notso-murky past as the highest Administration official to address a Jewish organization since President Reagan took office 14 months ago described the charge as "scurrilous" and "outrageous.

In an address to young Jewish leaders from across the country attending the third annual United Jewish Appeal Young Leadership Conference in Washington, Vice President George Bush spoke on a range of topics concerning the Jewish community including the AWACS debate. He declared: "To say that someone is disloval to America because he or she has an abiding affection for another country is an insult. It's offensive. And it's just basically un - American.'

Bush stressed that those who made the charge "did an injustice to all Americans whose birthright it is to dissent. And I reject as equally outrageous the notion that this charge came out of the White House." While Bush might view as "equally outrageous" that the charge of dual loyalty came from the White House, it nevertheless is a point of contention in a report by the American Jewish Committee in New York released the same week as Bush spoke in Washington.

The AJCommittee report, titled "The AWACS Debate: Is There An Anti-Semitic Fallout?" noted in reviewing the events of the AWACS dehate that "for the first time in recent memory an American Administration impugned the lovalty of the American Jewish community (saving) that Jews were 'casting undue influence' on the legislative process The Administration set the tone for debate, managing to convey the notion that the American Jewish community was disloyal, that Jews who fought the sale were fighting against America's best interests. Many non - Jewish legislators who opposed the sale on the merits were accused of fearing cessation of Jewish financial support." The report also points to "threats that dire consequences would ensue for Jews in America if the sale did not go through ... "

For the Administration's part, the report said that President Reagan, three weeks after he won Congressional approval of the sale, expressed his profound concern over the anti-Semitic aspects of the debate. But while Bush may profess that the tone was not set in the White House and the charges are outrageous, the report by the AJCommittee does draw broad implications once again that the Reagan Administration should be judged by its actions and not its words.
