"Once again your myopic and blind-spotted camera completely omitted scenes that demonstrate the fact that Israel's ideals of human rights, Jewish cultural and spiritual revitalization and political and economic self-determination are a living reality, despite her struggle for existence.

"Your viewers were not given the slightest glimpse of the normal, vibrant and pulsating life of Israel whose people pursue their daily tasks, calmly and efficiently without hindrance in a free society; whose children go to school no differently than their peers in the Western democracies; whose creative and performing artists and writers are involved in producing a vital throbbing cultural renaissance; whose people are dedicated to peace, to human dignity and to democracy's and Judaism's finest ideals.

"I would have thought you would want to balance your previous deplorably pro- PLO program this time. Instead, you have added insult to

injury. In consequence, I and many other viewers will turn to other channels for the objective coverage which can no longer be had from the biased reporting of ABC-TV.

"I cannot imagine that your advertisers can be happy at the fact that it has become impossible for so many of their prospective consumers to continue to watch ABC-TV, and who in their dismay and indeed, outrage at your blatant anti-Israel bias, will turn away from their products in protest."

is still under discussion in Cairo. But in the ruins of Yamit or nearby, some Egyptian flags were already to be seen in the early hours, raised by Bedouins waiting to move in to take whatever had been left behind.

Within the ruins of Yamit, a small group of some 20 anti-withdrawal demonstrators, led by Kiryat Arba Rabbi Moshe Levinger, were allowed to remain over Shabbat in the Sephardi Synagogue, the only building still standing among the ruins. The group was joined by a few Jerusalem rabbis allowed to spend the last Sabbath there, and a couple of hundred anti-withdrawal movement members who infiltrated back into the area. At a ceremony in the synagogue, Rabbi Haim Druckman and the militants announced the establishment of a new political party, to be called "Shvut Israel," (Israel Return), working for the return of the evacuated area to Israel.

In a lengthy order of the day, Defense Minister Ariel Sharon declared that Israel was not retiring from Sinai but evacuating willingly for peace. He said that the town of Yamit had been destroyed and razed to the ground to prevent the shedding of Jewish blood. He said that this was the first time in Israel's history that such action had been undertaken willingly. Sharon praised the soldiers who had taken part in the Yamit operation, "evacuating their brothers and sisters, not with violence but with love and understanding..."

Shortly before noon the southern front commander toured the international border from the ruins of Yamit where some 2,000 militants had been ousted and 600 houses destroyed, to Taba south of Eilat, where soldiers now staff a temporary line running just south of the disputed Rafi Nelson village and a luxury hotel complex still abuilding. The exact line of the agreed border is still to be determined.

THOUSANDS MARK WARSAW GHETTO REVOLT

NEW YORK (WNS) -- Thousands of people gathered at Temple Emanu-El, outside on Fifth Avenue and inside the sanctuary, for the annual ceremony marking Yom Ha-Shoah and the 39th anniversary of the Warsaw Ghetto uprising.

In a somber ceremony attended by survivors of the Nazi concentration camps and those who fought in the ghetto resistance movements, speaker after speaker attacked revisionist historians who claim the Holocaust a hoax or who distort the truth of the Nazi crimes which took the lives of an estimated six million Jews.

Benjamin Meed, president of the Warsaw Ghetto Resistance Organization (WAGRO) sponsor of the event, stressed a similar theme in his opening remarks to the filled synagogue. "We find our tragedy minimized by some -- vulgarized by others -- and even completely denied," Meed declared. But he stressed that those who survived "must speak out, must bear

witness as the truth of the Holocaust is obliterated..." He called the revisionists, "the distorters of history."

Israel's Ambassador to the United States, Moshe Arens, said that today, the struggle is still not over. He noted that Jews have Israel and a Jewish army capable of defending it against "terror and aggression." He said that when Israel is asked to make concessions, "to accept risks and let down our defenses," the answer "must be clear."

With Metropolitan Opera tenor Misha Raitzin chanting memorial prayers and ghetto songs, school children marched on to the presidium to light memorial candles for those killed by the Nazis. Following this, six survivors, joined by their children, lit six large white candles in memory of the six million Jews who perished. Following the lighting of the candles, Kaddish was chanted by Hirsh Altsky.

Also, as part of the ceremonies, there was a re-enactment of the reading of the Legacy of the Holocaust which was part of the final ceremonies culminating last year's World Gathering of Jewish Holocaust survivors in Jerusalem. Joseph Tekulsky, survivor of Warsaw, read the Legacy, while Joyce Celnik, daughter of survivors, read the Pledge of Acceptance. It was the first time this ceremony was performed in the United States.

Also announced at the mass memorial gathering were plans for an American Gathering of Holocaust Survivors in Washington, D.C. in 1983 to mark the 40th anniversary of the Warsaw Ghetto uprising. Similar to last year's World Gathering, the four-day meeting, represents "an important change (that) has taken place in Jewish life, not only in Israel, but throughout the world," according to Jack Eisner, vice president of WAGRO who made the announcement.
