U.S. VETOES ANTI-ISRAEL RESOLUTION

UNITED NATIONS (WNS) --An Arab sponsored resolution in the Security Council strongly condemning the shooting on the Temple Mount in Jerusalem was vetoed by the United States. The vote was 14 - 1 in favor of the draft which was initiated by Jordan and Morocco. U.S. Ambassador Jeane Kirkpatrick ex-Ambassador plained after the vote that the U.S. opposed the resolution because it implied that "the responsibility for this terrible event lies not with the individual responsible for the incident but with the Israeli authorities who unequivocally have denounced the act.'

She added: "Thus, as much as we condemn the act of violence that occasioned this debate of the Security Council, we must oppose this resoluwhich, in our tion, view, would make new acts of violencemore, not less, likely to take place in the future." The draft resolution declared that the Security Council "condemns in the strongest terms these appalling acts of sacrilege'' and called on "Israel, the occupying power, serve and to obapply scrupulously the provisions of the Fourth Geneva Convention and the principles of law international governing military occupation and to refrain from causing any hindrance to the discharge of the established functions of the Higher Islamic Council in Jerusalem."

It deplored "any act or encouragement or profanation" of holy places and shrines in Jerusalem "as tending to disturb world peace." The resolution also called on the Secretary General to the Security keep Council "fully informed on the implementation of this resolution.



WHAT HAPPENS WHEN PEOPLE DIE?

Children experience death in many ways. When a pet dies, or perhaps a relative dies it's important to answer the child's questions directly and honestly, and not to say that the person went away or went to sleep. An indirect answer may cause children to become angry at the deceased for having gone away, or angry at God, or they may even be afraid of sleep. Hiding death from children is not helpful. Direct and honest answers mean saying that the person or pet has died and will no longer be part of our lives. It's helpful to tell the child that death is natural and that when we die our bodies don't feel anything. A child should be allowed to go to the funeral home, but never forced.
