

SUNRISE HOSPITAL OPENS SOPHISTICATED DIAGNOSTIC CENTER

The Sunrise Diagnostic Center -- a multi-million dollar facility designed to serve patients outside the more costly and stressful atmosphere of an acute care hospital -- will rival "anything on the west coast," a spokesman for the center said.

The center, occupying the entire first floor of the recently completed seven-story Sunrise Medical Plaza, is equipped with the latest state-of-the-art diagnostic systems including a full-body CAT Scan.

Built and solely owned by Humana Inc. of Louisville, Ky., the free-standing fac-

ility will also provide medical offices and suites for a wide variety of highly specialized physicians in private practice.

Although immediately adjacent to Sunrise Hospital Medical Center, the diagnostic center is operated separately, Roger Collins, executive director of Sunrise, said.

According to Collins, area physicians who have toured the new center have praised it as being "as fine an anything on the west coast" and claim it will save their patients time, money and travel ex-

penses incurred when they have been referred to out of state diagnostic centers for complete evaluations.

Collins said Humana "recognized the need for the diagnostic center some time ago, as the medical community in Las Vegas became larger and more sophisticated. Because it is so close to the hospital, should further diagnostic examinations need to be done in a hospital environment, there is virtually no inconvenience for the patient."

The 15,500 sq.-ft. center, constructed and equipped at

a cost of more than \$3.5 million, is capable of a wide variety of diagnostic detections, including cardiovascular disease, cancer, neurological disorders and nephrology.

Ann Wagner, director of the center, said that in addition to standard x-ray and fluoroscopy, the radiology department includes the fullbody CAT scanner, one of the most sophisticated diagnostic tools available.

"Now, these men and women don't have to go out of state," she said, "because no matter what sophisticated testing their

physician orders, it can be done right here."

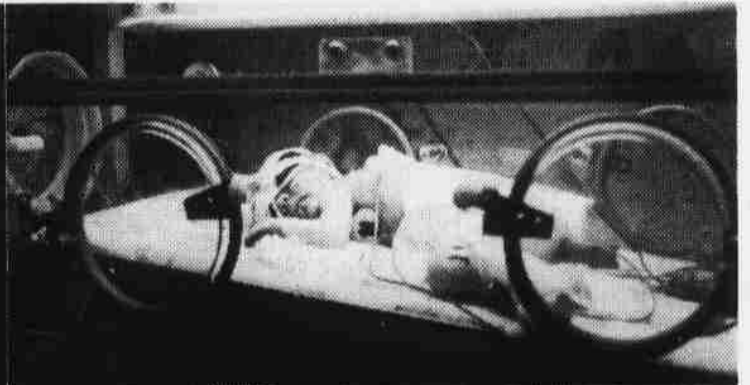
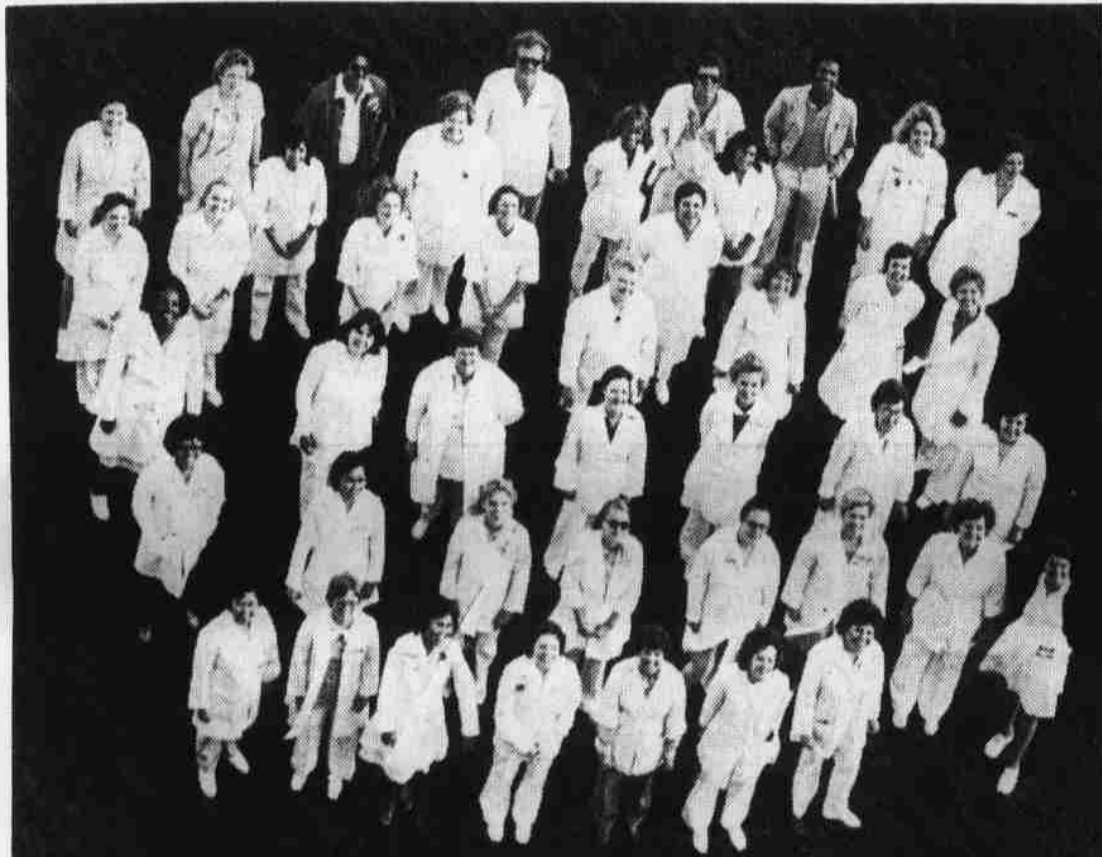
Steven Friedman, son of Mr. & Mrs. Richard Friedman, was called to the Torah and became a Bar Mitzvah during services at Temple
