For your ownbackground information, the President proposes to abolish the Railroad Retirement Board and to merge the railroad retirement system into that of So-Security. SSA would then assume responsibility for administering the portion of the current benefit that is equivalent to Social Security. A new private benefit corporation would administer the industry pension. The dual benefit would continue to be financed federally and administered.

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benefit would continue to be funded by the fegovernment, deral the Administration has proposed limiting appropriations to the dual benefit fund -- as much as \$28 million below the amount approved in FY 82 and a whopping \$54 million below what Congressional Budget Office estimates is needed for coming year. Third, abolishing the Railroad Retirement System does not subject the private pension plan (Tier II) part of railroad retirement to important protections of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act (ERISA).
