BONA BROCKETT FILES FOR JP



Bona Brockett filed for the office of Justice of the Peace of Las Vegas township. The 29-year-old former model and T.V. personality has seven years of courtroom experience in

civil and criminal litigation.

Miss Brockett is very concerned over the major problems facing the public in Clark County, namely which is crimes of violence in our streets.

She is deeply bothered by a further major problem, mainly sexual harassment.

Miss Brockett went on to say, that if elected she will use the entire force and power of her judicial office to effect changes in our state laws, to wit; state criminal laws which would give major penalties to sexual harassment.

BOB ROBINSON TRIES FOR STATE SENATE

Assemblyman Bob Robinson, a 10-year veteran of the Nevada Assembly, announced he will seek the Democrat nomination for Senate District 6.

Robinson served during the 1981 legislative session as chairman of the Assembly Commerce Committee, the panel responsible for all legislation involving banking, savings and loan associations, thrifts, credit unions, insurance, real estate, many regulatory boards and most health care regulatory legislation.

He also served on the Ways and Means Committee, which

approves or denies all spending requests and ultimately presents the state budget to the Assembly.

Robinson said he made the decision to leave the Assembly and seek election to the Senate "because I believe I can be even more effective in representing my district in the Senate. It is only half the size of the Assembly, so I feel I can have twice the impact and make twice the contribution."

He and his wife, Betty, live at 417 Lacy Lane. They have one son.

JOHN T. MORAN FILES FOR SHERIFF

Former Las Vegas Chief of Police, John T. Moran, filed for the office of Sheriff of Clark County.

Moran, a police officer in Las Vegas since 1948, said he is running for the county position because the present sheriff has shown a complete lack of understanding for the job, allowed crime to escalate, destroyed department morale and displayed a flair for fiscal irresponsibility.

"John McCarthy has gone on record as saying crime is out of control and he can't do anything about it. I believe we can do something about it, but we must act now," Moran said. "The crime rate can be reduced, and without a \$4 million bond issue. The people have paid enough and it's time for some action."

Moran said he has broad support among

officers and employees of the Metropolitan Police Department.

"There must be a reason why so many uniformed officers and employees of Metro would risk their jobs to openly support my campaign," Moran pointed out. "Department morale is at an all time low, and I believe it's time to put some pride back into the badge."

"Since his election," Moran said, "McCarthy's budget has more than doubled -- and so has crime. McCarthy's answer is to raise all our taxes by four million dollars. I think that's not only unnecessary, but irrational as well."

"The present budget is sufficient to handle the Clark County crime problem, but only if it's placed in the hands of a competent, fiscal police administrator."

LOU TABAT SEEKS THIRD TERM

Constable Lou Tabat has announced that he will seek reelection for the North Las Vegas Township. Tabat, 58 years of age is running for his third term and ran unopposed the last election.

Tabat, who has been with the office for 14 years, has also been appointed, by Judge Gary Davis as alternate Municipal Judge.

The candidate has been re-elected as a permanent President of the National Constables Association and has 850 members under his leadership

throughout the United States. Constable Tabat is also retired from the Air Force and is presently a World Boxing Judge as well as a U.S. Olympic Chairman for Nevada. Being a community-minded man, he is also a Director for the North Las Vegas Chamber of Commerce.

Constable Tabat is married, has three sons and two daughters.

The Constable's Office is associated with the North Las Vegas Justice Court under the Judgeship of James Kelly.

JACK JEFFREY SEEKS REELECTION

Assemblyman Jack Jeffrey, chairman of the Economic Development and Natural Resources Committee, announced today he will seek reelection to a fifth term as representative of District 22.

The 44-year-old Henderson Democrat, who opposed increasing the state sales tax during the 1981 legislative session, said one of his major priorities in 1983 will be reduction of the current 5.75 percent sales tax.


Jeffrey was chairman of the subcommittee which developed Nevada's strong fire safety and retrofitting law during the 1981 session

following the fires at the MGM and Hilton Hotels.

"I think the retrofitting legislation was one of our key accomplishments," Jeffrey said, "because it demonstrated to all tourists and travelers that their safety was our principal concern. The tourist can come to Nevada with the full knowledge that tragic loss of life because of fire will not occur again."

He has also supported repeal of the sales tax of food and the personal property tax.
