JERUSALEM (WNS) -- The Knesset, by a vote of 58 - 54, endorsed a policy statement by Premier Menachem Begin that Jewish settlements will never again be removed even in the context of peace agreements with Arab countries, and that Israel will lay formal claim to the West Bank and Gaza Strip at the end of the five - year autonomy transition period.

The Knesset debate on the government's policy with respect to the settlement issue and the future status of the occupied territories opened when parliament reconvened for the summer session after the Passover recess. Just a day earlier, the Cabinet decided to submit to the Knesset a statement of policy rather than the Premier's original intention to submit a draft resolution forbidding the uprooting of Israeli settlements in future peace negotiations.

Fresh in mind was the final evacuation of Sinai, carried out on April 25, the forcible re-moval of anti - withdrawal die-hards by unarmed Israeli troops and the leveling of the town of Yamit by army bulldozers -- events that appeared to have had a traumatic effect on Israelis who watched them on television.

The Knesset was addressed by Begin and by Shimon Peres, chairman of the opposition Labor Party. Although the policies of the Likudled government and those of the opposition are

Ingredients for a Happy Marriage

The secret ingredients of mutual happiness in long term marriage appear to be the joint sharing of power and intimacy in meeting the challenges that one half century of married life presents -- input in decision - making; ability to influence one's spouse; shared interests and activities; open communication; and expressing and receiving affection and appreciation. This was the conclusion of a study by Tel Aviv University psychologist Dr. Ariella Friedman and Dr. Judy Todd of California State University which surveyed thirty couples married over forty-five years regarding their distribution of power, their degree of intimacy, and their marital happiness.

Men were found to be happier in marriage than women. The explanation of the psychologists for this finding is that in that generation which held a traditional view of marriage, the husbands exerted most of the power, and power was found to be a factor paramount to the happiness of both.

Power and intimacy were important to both sexes. The two factors interacted so that power was less important to those couples with a greater level of intimacy, and for those with a high level of power, intimacy was less crucial for their happiness. Since in these couples, married forty - five to sixty - six years (fifty years on the average), both from the United States and from Israel, Jews and non-Jews, men exerted more power than women, husbands were happier according to the study. Concludes the study, "making marriage a positive institution for both sexes would appear to depend on equalizing
