

### VIOLENCE CONTINUES IN OCCUPIED AREAS

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Violence continued to flare in the occupied territories. A 13-year-old Arab schoolgirl was fatally shot by Israeli troops in Khan Yunis in the southern Gaza Strip and another girl was wounded. The dead girl was identified as Ahasan Abudaraz. An Army spokesman said the soldiers opened fire, aiming at the legs, when the students broke out of their classrooms and attacked troops with pieces of broken furniture and rocks. According to a military spokesman, the riot was incited by 10 masked men who invaded the classroom and urged students to attack the soldiers outside. Two of the masked men

were arrested, he added. He said the soldiers took "all precautions required by regulations" before opening fire. In other developments, two youths among a group of some 100 rioters attacking an army post in the Jebeliya refugee camp near Gaza were wounded when soldiers in the post opened fire to drive off the rioters. The rioters threw rocks and a gasoline bomb at the army post, and the soldiers first responded with rubber bullets and tear gas before opening fire at the attackers' legs, army sources said. Near Jenin on the West Bank four youths were killed when a land mine exploded, the sources said.

### DID U.S. SELL ARMS TO JORDAN?

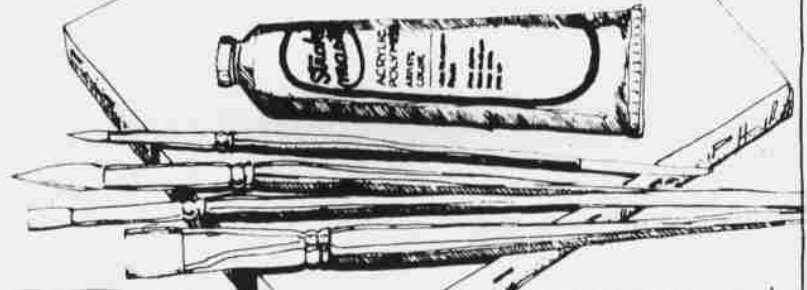
WASH. (WNS) -- The State Department refused to confirm that the Reagan Administration has decided to sell weapons to Jordan. "We have been holding discussions with the Jordanians about the possibility of some military sales," Department spokesman Dean Fischer said. Fischer was responding to a question about reports that at meetings in Jordan between U.S. Defense Department and Jordanian officials during the week of April 25, the U.S. agreed to sell Jordan F-50 aircraft which is superior to the present American made fighters Jordan has and stronger anti-aircraft missiles, a missile which can be fired from the shoulder of an infantryman. The Pentagon offi-

cials reportedly offered these weapons while turning down

the F-16 jets and Hawk mobile missiles the Jordanians want. Since it was reported earlier that the U.S.

may sell those weapons to the Jordanians, there has been an outburst of opposition to the sale in Congress.
