GOLAN OCCUPANTS TO COMPROMISE

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Golan Druze, now in the 16th week of their strike to protest the extension of Israeli law to the region, were reported to have accepted a compromise solution to the problem of Israeli identity cards which the Israeli authorities insist they must have.

Under the proposal worked out by an Israeli judge from Haifa, the Golan Druze would be given a choice of what nationality and religion should be entered on their cards. The Golan residents insist that they are Druze by religion, Arabic by language and ethnic background, and Syrian by nationality. Those who claim to be Syrian nationals would not be entitled to welfare benefits from Israel. The proposals are reported to have been forwarded to Israeli authorities for their examination and possible acceptance.

Meanwhile, Israeli authorities have arrested two more Druze on the Golan raising to 20 the number of Druze now being held in administrative detention. This means imprisonment without charges brought against the detainees.

One of the two arrested is a religious leader who allegedly prevented pro-Israel Druze on the Heights from participating in religious ceremonies. A restraining order was issued against another Druze in Madjal Shams village. Complaints by Golan Druze that Israeli soldiers violated their civil rights were discussed by the Knesset's State Control Committee on May 4. Coalition MKs protested on grounds that the matter should be investigated by the State Comptroller, not by the committee.

DEATHTRAP AT MEADOWS MAY 25

DEATHTRAP, a mystery play that at its Broadway opening immediately joined the ranks of such immortal stage thrillers as ANGEL STREET and NIGHT MUST FALL, will be the next attraction of The Meadows Playhouse. Ira Levin's suspense-comedy hit will begin a run of 4 weeks beginning May 25 and running through June 19.

The leading character of DEATHTRAP is himself a guileful craftsman of stage thrillers, but his successes reside in the distant past. He now supports himself by teaching at a university, though his wife's income provides the comforts he enjoys in his chic suburban Connecticut cottage that is adorned with terrifying murder weapons. This collection of lethal daggers and spears, crossbows and garottes are mementoes of the mystery writer's past productions, and he is clearly not adverse to using any one of them to get himself another hit.

in one of his writing seminars has just sent him a copy of a murder mystery. The writer offers the young man the benefit of his experience as collaborator on this script, never admitting that it is perfect as it stands. When he refused, the older writer proposes to do away with the recalcitrant student and present the play as his own.

Out of this seemingly straightforward announcement of intended murder follows a most intricate and surprising twist of plot that propels the events into further dark deeds of mayhem. Los Angeles based director Michael Edwards will direct this production. Tony DeBruno, an Equity actor from Tucson, Arizona, will play Sidney Bruhl, the older writer, Darryl Hollenbeck will play Clifford Anderson, the young writer, Kathryn Sandy O'Brien will play Myra Bruhl, the overwrought wife and Doreen Kuhl will play Helga Ten Dorp, the European clairvoyant.

JERUSALEM MUST BE INCLUDED

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Israel pronounced as official policy that it will not participate in the autonomy negotiations with Egypt and the U.S. unless Jerusalem is included among the three capitals where the negotiators meet, a communique issued by the Cabinet following its weekly meeting said. Premier Menachem Begin charged that Egypt was responsible for the failure to resume the long stalled talks by its refusal to send its delegation to Jerusalem.

The Cabinet stated that it was unacceptable that Israel should agree to a boycott of Jerusalem and therefore Israel would not respond favorably to an American invitation to hold the talks in Washington unless they are held in Jerusalem as well. Israel, the Cabinet said, wants the autonomy negotiations to resume without further delay. While Begin insisted that the meet-

ings be held in Jerusalem, he said he didn't care where the Egyptian delegation stayed between negotiation sessions. "I never ask a man where he spends his nights," the Premier said. Defense Minister Ariel Sharon said Israel should insist that the first round of talks be held in Jerusalem when they are resumed inasmuch as Israel was the next scheduled meeting place when the negotiations were suspended months ago. Other ministers maintained that the order was unimportant as long as Jerusalem was accepted in principle as one of the meeting sites. Richard Fairbanks, the U.S. special envoy to the autonomy talks arrived in Israel in an effort to resolve the dispute and get the talks moving. He is scheduled to meet with Begin, Sharon and other officials. After his meetings here, Fairbanks will go to Cairo.
