# THREATS TO ISRAEL'S PEACE OUTLINED BY DEFENSE MINISTER

## ARIEL SHARON TALKS OF TERRORISM, WEAPONS

WASHINGTON (WNS) -- Defense Minister Ariel Sharon, who arrived in the United States recently for meetings with representatives of American Jewish organizations, continued throughout the latter part of his visit to stress Israel's growing concern over United States arms deals in Arab countries, particularly what is reported to be the Administration's imminent proposal to sell advanced weaponry to Jordan.

The Israeli Defense Minister met with Secretary of Defense Caspar Weinberger for hours of talks and as he emerged, Sharon emphasized what he considered threats to peace in the region. These threats are Arab terrorism; the supply of modern weapons to Arab countries, especially Jordan; and what he called a "new coalition" being formed around Iraq, with Jordan and Saudi Arabia and with the "support" of Egypt and possible backing by the U.S. He denied he was charging that Egypt is a threat to peace.

Sharon, who stressed that he was invited to the Pentagon during his brief private visit to the U.S., said that there had been no discussion of the memorandum of understanding on strategic cooperation between the United States and Israel which Sharon and Weinberger signed last December. However, a Pentagon spokesman said that the talks were the opening round in discussions of the memorandum of understanding.

One of the main purposes of Sharon's visit
