

JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

LONDON (WNS) -- Pope John Paul II will hold a brief meeting with Sir Immanuel Jako-bovits, British Chief Rabbi, during his visit here unless it is cancelled because of the Falklands conflict. They will meet in Manchester which contains Britain's second largest Jewish community. Afterwards, the Pontiff will also briefly meet with other leaders of the Jewish community.

LONDON (WNS) -- Yiddish spoken with an Oxford accent may result from a program to be launched by the Oxford Center for Post Graduate Hebrew Studies, under the guidance of its principal, Dr. David Patterson. The intensive one - month course, to be held in August, is being organized because of the growing interest in Yiddish among academics and laymen, David Katz, a research Fellow at the Ox-ford Center said. About 40 students are expected to take part in the summer course.

BONN (WNS) -- Israeli and West German diplomats are seeking to create a warm atmosphere for the visit to Israel, by Foreign Minister Hans-Dietrich Genscher. The Israeli Ambassador to West Germany, Yitzhak Ben Ari, said in an interview that the visit would mark a positive shift in German - Israeli relations. Ben Ari observed that while there are differences on how to achieve an overall settlement of the Arab - Israeli conflict, "the aim of Bonn and Jerusalem was a remains the same -- a just and lasting peace."

PARIS (WNS) -- A Bar owner in Besancon was fined 5,000 Francs (\$840) after a local court found him guilty of incitement to racial hatred and racist practices. Claude Qurdot, 54, pasted a notice on the bar's door stating that this establishment is out of bounds to monkeys and Jews. The court also ordered him to pay damages to two civil liberties organizations which complained to the police.

BONN (WNS) -- Michael Kuehnen, a 26-yearold neo - Nazi activist serving a four year prison term, was sentenced to an additional nine months by a Flensburg court which found him guilty of producing and disseminating anti-Semitic and racist propaganda material from his prison cell. Kuehnen, formerly a second lieutenant in the West Germany Army, was originally convicted for neo - Nazi violence, in-
