PRAYERS IN CLASSROOMS

"No one will ever convince me that a moment of voluntary prayer will harm a child or threaten a school or state." With this resounding declaration, President Reagan announced at a recent White House Garden ceremony his support for a constitutional amendment to permit voluntary prayer in public schools. Such an amendment would override the 1962 Supreme Court decision that declared classroom prayer unconstitutional.

The announcement is a discouraging development for those who support the constitutional separation of church and state and for those who believe in freedom of religious pluralism in this country, both of which such an amendment could directly infringe upon.

By fulfilling an earlier campaign pledge, Reagan's announcement was immediately met with a fusilade of opposition from Jewish and Christian organizations, as well as the American Civil Liberties Union. These groups maintain, among other points, that prayers cannot be voluntary when mandated by a school system since a child who did not want to participate would be subjected to ridicule from classmates or forced by peer pressure to take part in whatever ceremony was being held.

One critic from the American Jewish Congress said: "The Jewish Community, in particular, is acutely aware of government imposed religion...It is for this reason that many of our ancestors fled Europe." An official from a Baptist organization termed the President's announcement as "the politicizing" of prayer and said that "involving government in prayer would trivialize and secularize prayer."

From a political standpoint, Reagan's announcement was idealy timed to grasp back his disenchanted moral right conservative constituency who can use this as ammunition in the 1982 elections. As in the past, the moral right groups will be able to "target" a candidate and make his support or opposition to this amendment an issue come election time.

For whatever his reasoning, the President is a difficult man to convince otherwise once he has put his stamp on an issue. It is interesting, however, to question whether a man of the President's stature and knowledge sincerely believes that the imposition of voluntary school prayers would not pose a type of emotional threat to eight and nine - year - old students and whether he truly believes that such an amendment would not affect the religious diversity of this country.

WOMEN ENJOY HIGH STATUS

It is often the man who has a lesser status than the woman in Jewish Law, says Rebbetzin Ayala Gliksberg in a study on the status of women in Judaism for the M.A., degree is Philosophy at Bar - Ilan University.

The home is not built on competition between the sexes or the individuals but on a scale according to their functions.

There has been advancement in the status of women in Judaism during the past few generations. One example is in professional educa-Already 200 tion. years ago, a rabbinic ruling was given that a father should provide his daughter with professional education.

Mrs. Gliksberg points out that the striving of men and women to be equal is unnatural, and may even be a distortion of society. However, there is need for freedom of choice, as well as equal opportunities. for both sexes. One of pressing the more of the problems present generation is how to help women integrate successfully into the economic society by way of participating in public activities and developing

careers. There are various approaches to this topic. The first is the approach which negates outside activities and states that woman's place is in the home. This really means she has a full - time job, yet is not allowed public appearances. The next approach is that the woman'' "working must be accepted as a temporary must. TWO ACCUSED NAZIS GO TO TRIAL

CHICAGO (WNS) --A man accused of having served as company commander of seven SS units in concentration camps and training SS recruits for concentration camp guard duty goes on trial this week in U.S. District Court on charges that he lied about his Nazi past to secure U.S. citi-

zenship. Conrad Schellong, a 72 - year - old retired machinist is among 22 alleged ex-Nazis prosecuted by being the Justice Department's Office of Special Investigations (OSI). According to OSI director Allan Tyan, investigators found that Schellong was an SS Commander at Dachau and served as a major and lieutenant colonel in the Waffen SS, He came to the U.S. in 1957 and obtained citizenship in 1962, the OSI re-ported. It filed its complaint against
