A former Little League coach and Cub Scout district worker, Sedway is secretary of the Nevada State Board of Optometry Examiners, a past board member of FOCUS Youth House and served on the Governor's Task Force on Rural Health Emergency Services under then Gov. Mike O' Callaghan's appointment.

Sedway is a former member of the Clark Democratic County Committee and was chairman of county Humphrey For the President Committee in 1968.

Sedway said he will serve "as a citizen legislator, not as a professional legislator.

He is filing for the Assembly 15 seat being vacated by Nick Horrn.
