

# JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

VIENNA, Austria -- A bomb exploded near the front entrance of Nazi hunter Simon Wiesenthal's home causing heavy damage but no injuries.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- The remains of Maj. Jonathan Ophir, an Israeli Air Force pilot missing in action 8 - 1/2 years after the Yom Kippur War, were laid to rest in the military cemetery on Mt. Herzl. The remains were recently handed over to Israel authorities by the Egyptians. The pilot's mother, wife and his daughter, along with hundreds of other mourners, were at the graveside as the Chief Military chaplain, Rabbi Gad Navon, eulogized Ophir as "one of the true heroes of Israel" who made it possible for the Jewish people to live in this country.

WASHINGTON (WNS) -- Twenty - two U.S. Senators have called on the Reagan Administration to engage in "serious and intensive discussions with the Rumanian government on the decline in Rumanian Jewish emigration in recent years and reports of oppression suffered by Christian groups in Rumania before the Administration recommends to Congress renewal of Most Favored Nation (MFN) trade status to the East European nation.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Israel law courts were brought to an almost complete halt by striking clerks who barricaded the entrance to the courts with chairs and tables. The strike for higher wages began in Tel Aviv and spread to the courts in Haifa and Jerusalem, including the Supreme Court. The clerks allowed people who could prove they had an urgent case to enter the courts.

AMSTERDAM (WNS) -- The new Dutch Cabinet has one Jewish member as was the case with the outgoing Cabinet. He is Max Rood, a professor of law at Leyden University, who will serve as Minister of Interior. Rood is Jewish on his mother's side and is linked to a prominent Orthodox family in Amsterdam. But he has not been active in Jewish affairs.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- CIA director William Casey warned that the Soviet Union is financing the Palestine Liberation Organization as part of its support for terrorist operations throughout the world. In an address before the Anti-Defamation League of B'nai B'rith, Casey described international terrorism as a "monster" which ranges across five continents.

BONN (WNS) -- Chancellor Helmut Schmidt has complained in a meeting with American journalists reported here that television stations in the United States were projecting an image of Germany largely influenced through films dealing with the Nazi era. Schmidt told his audience that time and time again he has seen such films during visits to America.

UNITED NATIONS (WNS) -- The Security Council unanimously adopted a resolution calling for the withdrawal of Israeli troops from Lebanon "forthwith and unconditionally." The resolution was the second adopted by the council in two days. A resolution calling for a ceasefire in Lebanon and across the Israeli-Lebanese border was unanimously adopted. The fighting continued however as Yehuda Blum, Israel's Ambassador to the UN said in an address to the Council that its members have "not the slightest interest" in terrorist acts perpetrated by the PLO against Israeli civilians. "How many Israelis have to be killed by terrorists for this Council to be persuaded that the limits of our endurance have been reached," Blum asked.

BONN (WNS) -- Two former SS officers were found guilty of complicity in the murders of 1000 Jews in the Ukraine during World War II. The two were sentenced by a Traunstein court. Franz Bauer, 64, from Altoetting was given 5 - 1/2 years and his co-defendant, Hans Hertel, 65, of Hamburg was sentenced to 3 - 1/2 years. Their trial, which lasted nearly six months, heard eye witnesses testify about the details of mass shootings, allegedly ordered by Bauer and Hertel. But there was no conclusive evidence that either man had personally participated.

WASHINGTON (WNS) -- The State Department said that U.S. special envoy Philip Habib will be in the Middle East in another effort to ease tension in Lebanon. Department spokesman Alan Romberg said Habib has already left the country on a private trip before going to the Middle East. It will be the retired diplomat's sixth mission to the region in the past 12 months as President Reagan's special emissary for the Lebanese crisis.

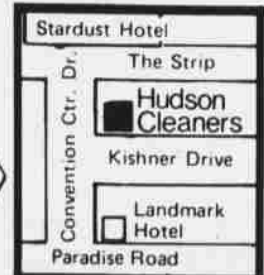
