defeated PLO via mediator Philip C. Habib, Dr. Hyatt rightly notes that "Israel has no guarantees from the United States nor the United Nations for its future security. Neither our Government nor any other has yet suggested any credible means of guaranteeing Israel the necessary safeguards for real peace."

He then queries: "How long was Israel expected to sit quietly by while her citizens were felled by the PLO -- a force which denies Israel's right to exist and whose avowed aim is its total annihilation? Israelis on their kibbutzim, in their moshavs and in their cities and villages were the targets of PLO shelling from Lebanon night after night in recent weeks while

at the same time, outside their boundaries, one Israeli Ambassador was gunned down by a PLO assassin and all Israeli diplomats and their families serving abroad were and still are under the constant threats of bombing, kidnapping, and murder at the hands of the PLO.

"Against these forces, is there any wonder that for its self protection Israel invaded Lebanon? The lessons were clear.

"Hopefully," Dr. David Hyatt concludes, "Israel's defeat of the PLO will now permit the Lebanese to reorganize their citizenry and regain control of their country. We pray that Israel's gallant efforts in guaranteeing world terrorism will be recognized by all who value democracy and freedom; and that reason, common sense and pragmatism will combine to forge a peaceful solution to the overall problem."

In contrast to the statement of our good friend Dr. Hyatt, a Christian, three Jewish dignitaries, to their shame, issued a statement in Paris last week urging Israel to lift its siege of Beirut and enter into negotiations with the murderous PLO. These Jewish leaders, strongly criticized by the ADL of B'nai B'rith, are Dr. Nahum Goldmann, Philip M. Klutznick and Pierre Mendes - France.

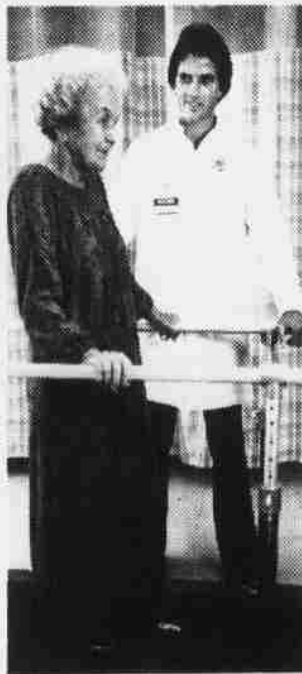
BOMB BLAST AT EL AL TERMINAL

BONN (WNS) -- A bomb hidden in a suitcase exploded in a hallway leading to the departure section next to the El Al terminal at Riem Airport in Munich. Seven persons were injured by the blast and the hallway was demolished. Five of the injured were released from the hospital. A German policeman and an El Al security guard are still hospitalized. Four of the injured are Israelis and the other three are Germans.

An El Al spokesman in Tel Aviv denied the bomb was aimed at the El Al plane, one of two

waiting for take off to Israel. The other was a Lufthansa. The El Al spokesman said the suitcase holding the bomb had arrived from Duesseldorf and had been checked through to Tel Aviv on a flight by Lufthansa. Nearly 400 persons were in the departure section, waiting to board the two flights to Israel, when the bomb went off. Both planes were searched for explosives after the blast but nothing was found.
