### "BABE" HAMMES FOR STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION

"Babe" Rose Hammes has filed a candidacy for State Board of Education, Sub - District "E." She is a twenty-eight year resident of Las Vegas and is married to Carl Lieb. Hilary Bloom is her daughter, married to Dr. David Bloom, a nephrologist and they live in Rancho Palos Verde, California.

Hammes has been involved in communal activities dating back to the week that she and the late Jack Hammes arrived in the city. Her first assignment was Sunday School teacher at Temple Beth Shalom when it was on the site of 13th & Carson. Close to this was charter membership in the Clark County Association of the Retarded and then she became a Girl Scout Troop Leader. In the interim were associa-

tions with the Economic Opportunity Board, Entertainment Chairman of Nevada American Bicentennial 1976 and various health agencies.

She has worked for the Helen J. Stewart School since the day it was opened at Eastern and Viking, which was ten years ago. For two years she was an Audio - Visual teacher aide on a one to one basis with the trainable mentally retarded. For the last eight years she has been Vice President of STARR (Service to Aid Retarded) which is an Auxiliary to the school providing academic and physical properties for the students. Hammes works to enlarge the concept of education for the retarded.

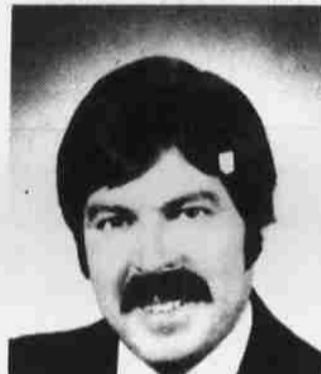
Fulfilling his desire and obligation to serve the community, Lyman ran and was elected to the Clark County School Board of Trustees in 1978.

Las Vegas teacher Larry Luna, 47, has filed for the Democratic nomination in Assembly District Nine.

He has been with the Clark County School District for 12 years and is presently teaching at Kenny Guinn Junior

High. He is seeking the seat vacated by Assemblyman Helen Foley.

Luna stated that although the District has changed slightly through re-apportionment, many of the issues have remained the same, such as high crime rates, taxation problems, unemployment and rising living expenses. Luna feels that the next legislative session will be crucial to Nevadans in finding solutions to these problems. Luna promises to provide that strong, decisive new leadership necessary to accomplish this.

Luna has served Federal, State and Local government in many capacities. He was appointed advisor to the Small Business Administration in Washington, D.C. and also served on the U.S. Commission of Rehabilitation Services.

### DAN GOLDFARB FILES FOR SCHOOL TRUSTEE

Certified public accountant Daniel Goldfarb has filed for election to the Clark County Board of School Trustees. Goldfarb, owner of his own accounting firm and Treasurer for the local United Way, said upon filing, "I want to make sure that every dollar coming into our school district goes to pay for services that directly help our students."

"As the father of five children educated in Clark County schools, and an accountant who has worked in this town for 25 years, I feel I have the ex-

perience, ability, dedication and time to get the job done right."

The new school superintendent Dr. Robert Wentz has said the major problem locally is coping with rapid growth and shrinking school revenues. "The School Board needs a person who can understand and deal with huge budgets. The CCSD budget is 266 pages long, and in order for Board policy to be effective, we must make sure the dollars go where the Board sends them," Goldfarb says.

Goldfarb has years of experience in helping local civic and youth groups with financial problems. He served as finance committee chairman for Frontier Girl Scouts, on the board of directors of both the Las Vegas Juvenile Diabetes Foundation and Las Vegas Sun Summer Camp Fund. In addition Goldfarb serves on the boards for Meadows Playhouse, Friends of Channel Ten and United Way of Clark County.

A Las Vegas resident since 1957, Goldfarb believes the school system can only be effective with community involvement. Parents, teachers and school administrators must work together if we are to keep this school district strong." Goldfarb pledged to work for an effective curriculum "that emphasizes the three 'R's," adequate compensation for "competent and energetic teachers" and sound fiscal management.

"The time has passed when our Board can be exclusively lay people. Our community needs to elect a forceful fiscal expert to the Board. I believe my public service experience would serve the children of Clark County well if I am elected."
