#### WILLIAMS SPEAKS OUT IN JUSTICE RACE

Candidate for the Nevada Supreme Court J. Williams Paul states Justice Gunderson is misleading the public on the performance by the Nevada Supreme Court when he states they have saved the Nevada Taxpayers nearly \$200,000 in per case

processsing costs. Similarly he states 800 cases were disposed of by the Court during a period when the Court issued only 206 written opinions.

Per case costs are not identified and a saving of \$200,000. equals approxima-tely 14% of the total Nevada Supreme Court Budget for the just completed fiscal 82 budget.

The Justice siclaims remilarly duction of the time from the filing of the brief to the time the attorney appears before the Court. The notice of appeal in 5 of the last 12 published opinions were filed from 3-1/2 to 2 years prior to the date of the opinion. One was 22 months prior, 3 were 18 months prior and of the remaining 3 were pre - trial writs of habeas corpus.

Williams received a degree with honor from W.M.A.; a B.A. from S.M.U. and his Juris Doctor from the University of San Francisco after a career in business management including administration of engineering development projects.

Williams states his experience in such administration and familarity with electronic data processing and computer technology will be invaluable assistance to the Court in ad-ministering the courts of Nevada, a duty with which the Supreme Court charged.

Initially, the Arabs wanted to place a plaque at the UN that would have been dedicated to the "Inno-Cent Palestinian and Lebanese children, victims of Israeli
