## WILLIAMS SPEAKS OUT IN JUSTICE RACE

Candidate for the Nevada Supreme Court Paul J. Williams states Justice Gundersen is misleading the public on the performance by the Nevada Supreme Court when he states they have saved the Nevada Tax-payers nearly \$200,000 in per case processing costs.

Similarly he states 800 cases were disposed of by the Court during a period when the Court issued only 206 written opinions.

Per case costs are not identified and a saving of \$200,000, equals approximately 14% of the total Nevada Supreme Court Budget for the just completed fiscal 82 budget.

The Justice similarly claims reduction of the time from the filing of the brief to the time the attorney appears before the Court. The

notice of appeal in 5 of the last 12 published opinions were filed from 3-1/2 to 2 years prior to the date of the opinion. One was 22 months prior, 3 were 18 months prior and of the remaining 3 were pre-trial writs of habeas corpus.

Attorney Williams is a long time practicing Nevada attorney with broad experience in representing a wide variety of clients, both large corporate and small individuals. Williams received a degree with honor from W.M.A.; a B.A. from S.M.U. and his Juris Doctor from the University of San Francisco after a career in business management including administration of engineering development projects.

Williams states his experience in such administration and familiarity with electronic data processing and computer technology will be invaluable assistance to the Court in administering the courts of Nevada, a duty with which the Supreme Court is charged.

## JEWISH WAR VETERANS HOLD 87TH CONFAB

WASHINGTON, D.C. -- Thousands of delegates from across the United States will participate in the Jewish War Veterans of the U.S.A.'s 87th annual convention, through September 12, 1982, at the Concord Hotel, Kiamesha Lake, New York.

Through workshops, seminars, and a variety of guest speakers, JWV delegates will focus attention on major issues of concern to them as American Jewish veterans.

As part of the convention program, JWV delegates will be briefed further on important Jewish issues such as the current crisis in Soviet Jewish emigration and the outbreaks of anti-Semitic incidents in Europe. One main guest speaker, Major General Menachem Meron, Military Attache of the Embassy of Israel, will discuss the latest mili-

tary and political developments in the Middle East.

## UN ENDORSES PALESTINIAN STATE

UNITED NATIONS (WNS) -- Concluding four days of debate at an emergency session on the Palestine question, the General Assembly voted 120-2 to endorse the establishment of a Palestinian state "in Palestine" and to condemn Israel for failing to comply with previous UN resolutions that it withdraw from Lebanon and dismantle the Jewish settlements on the West Bank. The United States and Israel voted against the resolution. Twenty countries, mostly Western democracies, abstained.

The resolution called for "the free exercise in Palestine of the inalienable rights of the Palestinian people to self-determination without external interference and to national independence." The resolution also called indirectly for sanctions against Israel by urging the Security Council to take "practical" measures against Israel if it failed to withdraw from occupied territories and from Lebanon.

The assembly also decided, in another resolution, to convene an international conference in Paris next August on the Palestinian question. The vote on this resolution was 123 in favor with the United States and Israel again casting the negative votes. Eighteen countries abstained.

The Assembly also voted to observe June 4 as "Innocent Children Victims" day. The vote was 102-2, with the U.S. and Israel opposed, and 34 abstentions. The June 4 date is to mark the day Israel prepared to enter Lebanon. The actual incursion was June 6. Initially, the Arabs wanted to place a plaque at the UN that would have been dedicated to the "Innocent Palestinian and Lebanese children, victims of Israeli

aggression." The plan was dropped at the urging of UN officials who argued that this would be regarded as an affront by Americans in general and New Yorkers in particular.
