HARRY KORIE FILES FOR COUNTY RECORDER

Harry K. Korie, first Hearing Master in Clark County Justice Court, has announced his candidacy for the office of County Recorder.

Long time manager of Stan's Men Shop, Korie was appointed Hearing Master in 1979.

Korie also is the first white American to be appointed as an Indian Police Officer in Arizona, California and Nevada (Mojave Tribes).

Korie initiated Night Court for the Justice Court System in Las Vegas to prevent a backlog of small claim and traffic cases, so that the citizens will not lose time on their jobs.

Korie is a member of the National Judges Association of Non - Attorney Judicial Officers in good standing.

Korie was honorably discharged from the United States Armed Forces, Special Services Division and produced major army shows in Camp Wheeler, Georgia. Also Special Services Division in the Philippines under General McArthur's command.

Prior to coming to Las Vegas, Korie worked for Gulf American Land Corporation, setting up the world's largest discount travel agency called "Travel Guild of America," to bring people into Cape Coral, Florida, for land sale in Florida. He was chief Coordinator for the "Miss International Beauty Pageant" in Denver, Colorado and Miami, Florida.

Then came the move

back to Hollywood and television where Korie produced the Johnny Ray, Diana Dore and Pat Henry Special entitled "From Hollywood." It was aired February 22, 1968, and is still in syndication.

To produce a movie called "The Fearless Five," an all black western with a cast of many of the top black stars in the industry is a dream Korie has had for a number of years and still clings to. "It was just too early at that time for that particular type of show," he explains. "But the package is ready and someday perhaps."

At present, spearheading a plaza on Fremont Street (from 5th street to the Union Plaza) green on Fremont - not money but trees to rid of the asphalt jungle which now exists, won unanimously with the Beautification Committee and now is before the City Commission for approval.

Korie is an honorary member of the International Union of Police Associations - AFL - CIO.

Korie produced criminal justice shows for Murry Westgate of Channel 5.

Korie lives in the West Charleston area and has a beautiful home with his four beautiful dogs (Great Dane, Dobberman, and two little playmates, Baby and Shanah). They think they are human beings and Korie thinks they are too.

BEKAERT FILES FOR ASSEMBLY

Jim Bekaert has announced he will challenge incumbent Janson Stewart in the Democratic primary for the District 14 Assembly seat.

Bekaert, 30, has lived in Nevada since 1964 and graduated from Basic High School and UNLV.

For the past two years, Bekaert has been a substitute teacher with the Clark County School District and also worked as a food-server at Sam's Town.

Bekaert, 3700 East Stewart Ave., Space 30, would like to see a program of rent justification on all properties where each rent hike would have to be approved by a board.

He also said there needs to be a limit on the number of increases in utility prices each year.

He also feels that plea bargaining should be restricted to first offenders.

The state's motorcycle helmet law should be repealed, according to Bekaert, who believes seat belts in cars could be the next area of mandatory regulation.

He also supports a public transporta-

tion system through Clark and Washoe Counties, which he believes could be self-supporting.

Bekaert earned a bachelor's degree in education from UNLV where he served in the university senate.

After his graduation in 1977, he moved to Battle Mountain where he taught special education, math, careers and history.

During his three years at Battle Mountain, he was instrumental in organizing the high school wrestling team and was in charge of the local radio station run by students.

He returned to Las Vegas in 1980 where he worked at Juvenile Court Services as well as various Strip hotels.
