

EUROPEAN MOTOR SHOW AT IMPERIAL PALACE

Another first for Las Vegas, the European Motor Sports Show will be held at the Imperial Palace Hotel/Casino during Grand Prix week, September 22 - 26.

The exhibit will be presented by the Beverly Hills Corporation, publishers of European Motor News, and is jointly hosted by Caesars Palace and the Imperial Palace.

The multi-million dollar exhibit of Europe's greatest motorcars will feature more than 30 vintage contemporary and race vehicles ranging from a stunning 1937 Mercedes-Benz 540-K to the new 1983 Lamborghini Jalepa, one of the first U.S. showings for the new Italian automobile.

Special emphasis will be placed on showcasing the finest of Europe's current pro-

duction including the Gerrari BB512i Boxer, the Lamborghini Countach, the Porsche 935 DP, the BWM M-1 and a wide selection of production and modified European Mercedes-Benz models all displayed in the plush carpeted comfort of the Imperial Ballroom in the spectacular Imperial Palace Hotel & Casino conveniently located just across the street from Caesars Palace Grand Prix Track.

A major extra attraction of the European Motor Sports Show will be an exhibit of more than 300 pieces of original automotive art ranging in value from \$250 to \$15,000, including 10 sculptures, being staged by Auto Art.

There will be a general admission charge of \$3.00 and visitors to the show are also encouraged

to view the Imperial Palace Auto Collection, one of the largest privately owned collections in the world encompassing more than 200 antique, classic, vintage and special interest auto-

cussion with the Israelis although some of the Arab Governments were briefed on it in advance of its public airing.

"Second, no matter how it is being labeled as following the concepts of Camp David, it does seem to have missed the genius of Camp David, the process of taking one step at a time when the parties involved get to know each other, allowing further steps to evolve, rather than specifying outcomes in advance.

"Third, the United States has stepped into a double role, that of protagonist for certain positions as well of mediator, and we are not certain this can work.

"Nonetheless, the initiative can become a positive step. While Israel has understandably rejected proposals in the Reagan plan, it is 'ready to renew the autonomy negotiations forthwith with the Governments of the United States and Egypt . . . in total conformity with the Camp David accords.' And since President Reagan goes not demand acceptance of all the points made in his letter and in his public address as a precondition to negotiations, it is now clearly up to the Arabs to demonstrate their willingness to negotiate.
