of Beirut, where he made his headquarters for some 12 years since being exiled from Jordan, Arafat met with Lebanese left wing leaders at the West Beirut home of leftist Druze leader, Walid Jumblatt.

According to an official count, der 14,000 just un-PLO fighters and Syrian soldiers (excluding women and children) have evacuated Beirut during the 10 - day period. They included 7,728 PLO terrorists, 2,651 members of the pro - Syrian Palestine Liberation Army (PLA); and 3,598 Syrian soldiers, Meanwhile the Israeli employees of Israel Radio, who were held Beirut by leftwing terrorists have been freed, an Israeli military spokes. man announced. cording to the spokesman, the two Israelis, a driver and a sound technician, were allowed to walk back to east Beirut across the Galerie Semena crossing point between east and west Beirut. The two Israelis were captured several days earlier when they drove by mistake into west Beirut which is now controlled leftwingers. Another Israel Radio em-Israel ployee, Sara Barkai, a reporter for the radio's French-language service, was freed September 1 after being captured with her two co - workers because she was holding a French passport.
