ALL FACTS IN ATROCITY

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- The three officials who will comprise the judicial commission of inquiry set up to investigate Israel's role in the massacre of hundreds of Palestinian civilians at the Shatila and Sabra refugee camps, allegedly by elements of the Christian Phalangist Militia, was announced here by the President of the Su-preme Court, Chief Justice Yitzhak Kahan, Acting under the provisions of the 1968

Commissions of Inquiry Law, Kahan, 69, and due to retire in a year, designated himself as chairman. He named as his colleagues Justice Aharon Barak, a former Attorney General, and Gen. (res.) Yonah Efrat who once commanded Israel's crack Golani Brigade and later served as commanding general of the central command.

The composition of the commission is bound to satisfy even the most skeptical that the inquiry will be conducted fairly and thoroughly. Kahan and Barak, are distinguished jurists, whose entire outlook is judicial and divorced from any other considerations. As for Efrat, 56, a lifelong soldier with an outstanding record, he has
