

ALL MILITARY FORCES OUT OF LEBANON

BY YEARS END

WASH. (WNS) -- All foreign military forces -- Syrian, the Palestine Liberation Organization, and Israeli, could be out of Lebanon by the "end of the year." This prediction was made by Israeli Foreign Minister Yitzhak Shamir in response to questions on the CBS-TV "Face the Nation" program. But Shamir indicated that Israeli forces may not leave Baabda, site of the Lebanese Presidential Palace three miles from Beirut and the area just south of Beirut International Airport until "a timetable" is drawn up for the withdrawal of all troops, despite demands by the U.S. that they leave those two areas now. Shamir said departure

from those areas as part of a general withdrawal "must be the logical conclusion." The Israeli Foreign Minister said he based his optimism on talks he had with U.S. special envoy Philip Habib. He said Habib told him that if the Syrians are willing to leave Lebanon as they promised, the only problem is the technicalities of withdrawal. Shamir said that if that happened, he does not believe PLO forces in northern Lebanon and the Bekaa valley would stay in Lebanon. "I don't think the PLO will remain there without the protection of Syrian troops," he said. "And we have no intention to stay an additional moment

in Lebanon when all the other forces will leave Lebanese territory." Shamir said Israel's security on its northern borders will have to be worked out between the governments of Israel and Lebanon. He said it could not be done by an international force -- such as the United Nations Interim Force in Lebanon (UNIFIL) -- or by a multinational force such as that composed of U.S. Marines, French and Italian troops, now in Beirut. He said the reason was that the PLO would try to re-infiltrate the territory and only the Lebanese army would be willing to fight them. Shamir added that Israel did not want to have U.S. Marines protecting its border.

PARTIAL TEXT OF CABINET STATEMENT

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- The following is a partial text of the Cabinet statement which summarized the government's version of the recent events leading to the call for the establishment of a judicial commission of inquiry. 1. The Cabinet resolved to hold a discussion on the appropriate method of examining the acts regarding the atrocities carried out by a unit from the Lebanese forces in Beirut and to report on its decisions. The Minister of Justice announced in the Knesset in the name of the government that the decision would be adopted in the very near future. 2. The Cabinet unanimously resolved to ask the President of the Supreme Court to examine the facts connected with the above mentioned atrocity. The Cabinet

is convinced that by employing this authority it took the appropriate way to examine the tragic incident as swiftly as possible and with complete objectivity. 3. "The President of the Supreme Court explained to the Minister of Justice that he could not consider the Cabinet's request because the Supreme Court, sitting as the High Court of Justice, has before it two appeals submitted on this issue which renders the matter sub judice. The judicial qualification of the appeals as stated would take a number of weeks at least. In order to put an end to the false libels to the effect that the Israeli government has something to hide in this matter or that it would like to avoid its full clarification, the Cabinet had decided, at the Prime Minister's suggestion, to revise its previous deci-

sion. 4. "The Cabinet resolved to establish a commission of inquiry according to the Law of Commissions of Inquiry, 1968. The matter which will be suggested to inquiry is all the facts and persons connected with the atrocity which was carried out by a unit of the Lebanese forces against the civilian population in the Shatila and Sabra camps. The Prime Minister will inform the President of the Supreme Court of the establishment of a commission of inquiry." ITALY'S TRADE UNIONS BOYCOTT ISRAEL

ROME (WNS) -- Two Israeli container ships were stranded September 23 in the Livorno port and 76 passengers on a El Al flight had to fend for themselves at the Rome airport because of a boycott by the powerful federation of Italy's three major trade unions as an aftermath of the massacre of Palestinian refugees in two camps near Beirut. Normal airport

service to transport El Al passengers from the landing point of the planes to the airport terminal and in handling of luggage of passengers has been suspended until October. A spokesman for one of the three unions said the unionized workers "refuse to furnish any sort of assistance to these flights, with the purpose of boycotting contacts with Israel." One result of the

boycott was to leave Israeli ships with no facilities for loading or unloading cargo. The first ships hit by the boycott were the "Zim Tokyo" and the "Zim Marseilles." There was no indication how long the ship boycott would last, or what would happen to handling of El Al flights to Rome after October.
