SHAMIR SPEAKS TO DEAF EARS AT UN

UNITED NATIONS (WNS) -- Declaring that the massacre of Palestinians at the refugee camps in west Beirut "brought shock, outrage and revulsion in Israel," Yitzhak Shamir, Israel's Foreign Minister, charged that while the perpetrators of this crime are "well known" and "they are not Israelis," blind hatred and false accusations were leveled against Israel.

Addressing the United Nations General Assembly in a 16-page speech that outlined Israel's foreign policy principles, Shamir spoke about the situation in the Middle East, the UN and its relations with Israel the state of Jewish communities in the world, and Israel's search for peace. But he spoke to a largely empty hall. Most of the Arab and Third World delegates left when he mounted the podium.

Shamir, in the course of his speech, said Israel remained "faithful to its com-mitment," under the mitment," under the Camp David accords, and cautioned against any deviation against them. Shamir said that those of Israel's who want neighbors peace will find that Israel is a willing partner. But he warned that those Arab countries which think they can weaken Israel by "dangling the word peace as a bair are de-luding themselves." He said the reward for peace is peace itself.

The Israeli Foreign Minister also rejected

mit proposals for a settlement with Is-rael. He said the Arab countries had created a "Palestinian problem and (are) using it as a weapon against Israel." He said any change towards a position of moderation from the Arab states, "must be reflected in deeds and in facts, not only in resolutions."

Shamir also said would his country welcome additional partners to the autonomy process under the CampDavidframework for autonomy for Palestinians residing on the West Bank and Gaza Strip. This appeared as a reference to Jordan to enter negotiations. He stressed however will not that Israel agree to discuss the creation of a "second Palestinian state." He asserted that "there is a great deal of logic" in the provisions of the Camp David accords for autonomy and that Israel is ready to renew those negotiations.

Noting that the United Nations had rejected the Camp David accords and the Israeli-Egyptian peace treaty, Shamir said, "Among the thousands of resolutions of the General Assembly and the Security Council or any other UN body during the past 30 years, one can hardly find a single decision or resolution that explicitly con-

He also charged that UN documentation "is replete with anti - Israel resolu-tions which have increased yearly in both number and length, overflowing with distorted suppositions, arbitrary statements, and one sided destructive recommendations and decisions.' With respect to the conditions of Jews in the world, Shamir charged that the "monster" attacks on Israel and on Zionism are a mask for anti - Semitism. He said Israel calls on all governments to join in a campaign against anti - Semitism.
