John has hit her three times, her fiveyear - old son twice. Each time he apologizes and promises never to do it again. But Catherine has heard these promises before -- about his drinking -- and things only got worse. Now the two - year - old's crying is getting on his nerves and she's afraid to leave the baby alone with him,

Catherine is not alone. A recent Gallup Poll found that 22 percent of American families are dramatically touched by alcoholism and problem drinking.

"Alcoholism is a family disease," says Mark Augenstein, Program Coordinator at Las Vegas North CareUnit, a facility that specializes in treating adult alcoholics and families.
