

\$50 MILLION RAISED IN AMERICAN SYNAGOGUES

More than \$50 million in Israel Bonds have been purchased as a result of High Holy Day Appeals on Rosh Hashanah (New Year) and Yom Kippur (Day of Atonement) in some 1,000 synagogues in the United States and Canada.

Rabbi Leon Kronish of Miami, Chairman of the Israel Bond Organization's Rabbinic Cabinet, reported that this year's holiday Bond subscriptions, represented a 40% increase over last year's appeals.

"Our theme this year," he said "was 'Vote for a Strong Israel Economy and a United Jerusalem.' Jewish congregants throughout North America expressed their overwhelming support for the economic development of Israel and the united capital of Israel through a record amount of holiday Bond purchases."

During this year's appeals, congregants were asked to indicate their Bond commitments on tab cards

and to drop them into ballot boxes, which had scenes of Jerusalem imprinted on them, following each Rabbi's Israel Bond sermon. In many synagogues, young people, generally of Bar or Bat Mitzvah age, served as ushers and collected the ballot boxes.

In his announcement Rabbi Kronish expressed "the deep gratitude of the Israel Bond Organization and the National Rabbinic Cabinet to our many colleagues throughout North America whose inspiring sermons and wholehearted cooperation helped make this year's High Holy Day Appeals one of the most successful in the 32-year history of Israel Bonds."

This year's appeals culminated a special Emergency Development for Peace campaign which was launched by the Israel Bond Organization last June to help offset the impact of the war in Lebanon on Israel's economy.
