33 JEWS ELECTED TO CONGRESS

WASH. (WNS) --Thirty - three Jews were elected to Congress, four to the Se-nate and 29 to the House, Including the four Jewish Senators whose terms were not up this year, the 98th Congress which takes office in January will have 37 Jews com-pared to 33 in the the current Congress.

Vic-The Senate included two tories incumbents who won terms, their second Sens. Howard Metzenbaum (D. Ohio) and Edward Zorinsky (D. Neb.), and two newcomers, Frank Lautenberg (D. N.J.) and Chic Hecht (R. Nev.).

The House victors included 22 incumbents and seven newcomers. The seat of one incumbent, Rep. Elliott Levitas (D. Ga.) be decided until November because of redistricting difficulties. Rep. Bob Shamansky (D. Ohio) was the only incumbent to be defeated. Another incumbent, Rep. Marc Marks (D. Pa.) did not seek reelection after three terms.

The election, with Jews winning Senate seats for the first time in New Jersey and Nevada and House seats in Alabama and Virdemonstrated ginia, that Jews can be elected on issues that have no effect on the community, Jewish without their religion being a factor in the contest.

Lautenberg, run-ning in his first election, came from way behind to defeat Rep.

MASSACRE SAYS CJF

LOS ANGELES (WNS) -- Martin Citrin, president of the Council of Jewish Federations, said here that reports of a break in world Jewry support of Israel in the wake of the war in Lebanon and the massacre of Palestinians in West Beirut refugee camps is grossly exaggerated. Addressing some 3,000 Jewish leaders and acrivists from the United States and Canada meeting at the 50th anniversary General Assembly of the JCF, Citrin declared:

"What we have lived through in the last several months has strengthened us. Let those who feel otherwise understand clearly that there is not now, never has been and never will be a single crack in the support of all of world Jewry where the continuing strength and security of the nation of Israel is imperiled." Citrin, whose address dealt with "insuring the commitment of the next generation," emphasized that to assure that commitment, it is necessary to create a joint agenda "for the people of Israel, the Jewish people, with the nation of Israel." Furthermore, he said, the basic element in that agenda "is to do what we can to help insure peace for that beleaguered land.'

But, Citrin pointed out, there is another side to this joint agenda. "As American Jews we must work with our Israeli brothers and sisters to help them understand us and we them," he said. "As we salure the saga of their accomplishments
