TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Israel's newest railway line was officially inaugurated when the first train travelled from Tel Aviv to Kiryat Gat, over a new track and parts of a rebuilt track along the old right-of-way. The new link involving 12 miles of completely new embankment and tack from Ashkelon to Kiryat Gat plus restoration of the Ashkelon-Ashdod line, part of the old Palestine - Egypt railroad, is intended to speed and serve potash and phosphate exports from the Dead Sea to Ashdod Port, bypassing the overloaded Lydda Junction.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- An Israeli soldier was killed and two others wounded when assailants in a passing car opened fire on their jeep about one kilometer north of Sidon in Lebanon. The slain soldier was identified as Karim Ali Amar, 23, of the Druze village of Hurfeish, a number of whose Druze residents have been called up for reserve duty only three days before his death.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- A five-day hunger strike by representatives of the Falasha community in Israel ended in Beersheba after Rafael Kotlowitz, head of the Jewish Agency immigration and absorption department, promised the Falashas the Agency would do its utmost the help Ethiopian Jews immigrate to Israel. He assured the Falashas that the government was doing everything it could to save the Jews of Ethiopia and to bring them to

WASHINGTON (WNS) -- The Justice Depart-ment has initiated action to deport a 59-year-old alleged Nazi collaborator who was stripped of U.S. citizenship by a federal court last March for participating in the murder of a Jewish family and killing a young Jewish child in the Ukraine in 1943. Bohdan Koziy, a native of the Ukraine and now a resident of Fort Lauderdale, Fla., is accused of concealing his activities on behalf of the Nazis during World War II as a policeman in the Ukraine. The Department said in papers filed in a U.S. immigration court in Miami that "Koziy's acts of persecution and murder and his concealment made his admission into the United States unlawful" and should therefore be deported.

BONN (WNS) -- The West German publication Staatsschutz has reported that many Jewish businessmen have recently received letters containing threats and anti - Semitic slurs. Ac-cording to the publication, the letters were mailed mostly to Jewish personalities in Hamberg, Berlin and Munich. Jewish institutions and households in West Germany have been maintaining a low profile in an apparent attempt to avoid exposing themselves to criticism and to violence.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Stone throwing and other public disturbances erupted on the West Bank on November 29 as Palestinians, mainly youths, demonstrated on the 35th anniversary of the United Nations partition resolution of November 29, 1947 which called for the establishment of Jewish and Arab states. Israeli officials said the incidents were minor compared to demonstrations on the same occasion in previous years.
