

**KIRK DOUGLAS HONORED**

Hollywood celebrities and studio executives assembled by the hundreds at the Century Plaza Hotel Saturday night to honor Kirk Douglas as he received the Albert Einstein Award from the American Technion Society. Douglas was presented with his award by long-time friend, Burt Lancaster, who served as the evening's Honorary Chairman.

In accepting his award, Douglas spoke of his deep love for Israel and his movie career in Israel which began with the making of "The Juggler," the first American film to be made in the State of Israel. He told of his first visit to the Wailing Wall, where people write their hopes and dreams on pieces of paper and place them in the crevices of the Wall. Douglas' written hope is among those in the Wall and it reads, "Israel forever!"

Douglas also appeared on the screen at the gala when a recent short film he made on the Technion - Israel Institute of Technology and its pioneering research and development was shown.

Barbara Walters, the Guest Speaker, recalled how at a meeting of writers many years ago, Kirk was the only one who spoke out when Israel was criticized. Walters went on to relate her fond re-

membrances of Sadat which began at the time of the historic Camp David Agreement.

Also on hand to officiate were Evelyn de Rothschild, Honorary Chairman of the International Board of Governors at the Technion; Dr. Jack Goldman, President of the American Technion Society, and Ben Winters, President of the Western Region of the American Technion Society.

Highlighting the festive evening was the Spanish singing sensation, Julio Iglesias, who gave the audience a dynamic half hour performance that brought a jubilant standing ovation.

Among those surrounded by a bevy of photographers were Lew Wasserman, Gregory Peck, Jack Valenti, Joanna Carson, Elizabeth Montgomery, Sally Struthers, Tova and Ernest Borgnine and Lester and Betty Deutsch (he is the Western Region Board Chairman of the American Technion Society), as well as Richard Benjamin, Paula Prentiss, Joan Collins and George Segal.

Joseph Fischer, President of UA-MGM, Robert Mc Namara, Robert Mitchum, Merv Adelson, Lorimar's Board Chairman, Ray Stark and Billy Wilder were also in attendance, as were Anne Douglas, and the four Douglas sons, Eric, Joel, Michael and Peter.

NEW YORK, N.Y. -- An opportunity for qualified undergraduate and graduate students to study in Israel at moderate cost during the summer of 1983 was announced by Bluma B. Stoler, Director of Student Programs for Tel Aviv University. Applications are now being accepted for the 1983 Overseas Student Program Summer Session at Tel Aviv University, world-renowned for academic excellence and located in the heart

of Israel. Undergraduates can attend a one-month program beginning July 4 and ending July 29, 1983. They may register for one six-credit Hebrew course, or one or two of these three-credit courses, taught in English by TAU's distinguished faculty:

- Modern Jewish History.
- The Geography of Israel.
- The Arab-Israeli Conflict.

The University also offers special six-

week graduate summer programs for social work and law students. The TAU School of Social Work Program will be conducted from June 12 through July 12, 1983. Two three-credit courses, taught in English, will be given:

- The Origins and Development of Social Work in Israel.
- Communities and Environment: Perspectives on Social Work.

The Law Program, a cooperative effort of Temple University Law School and the TAU Faculty of Law, will begin on June 27 and end on August 8, 1983. Courses will be taught in English by faculty members of both law schools and other leading institutions. Four two-credit courses will be given:

- Comparative Constitutional Law.
  - Comparative Criminal Law (including Biblical aspects).
  - Comparative Jewish and Muslim Law.
  - Legal Aspects of the Middle East Conflict and Resolution.
- On-campus dormitory accommodations are available to students for the duration of the Summer Session. The campus is just minutes away from the urban center of Tel Aviv.
