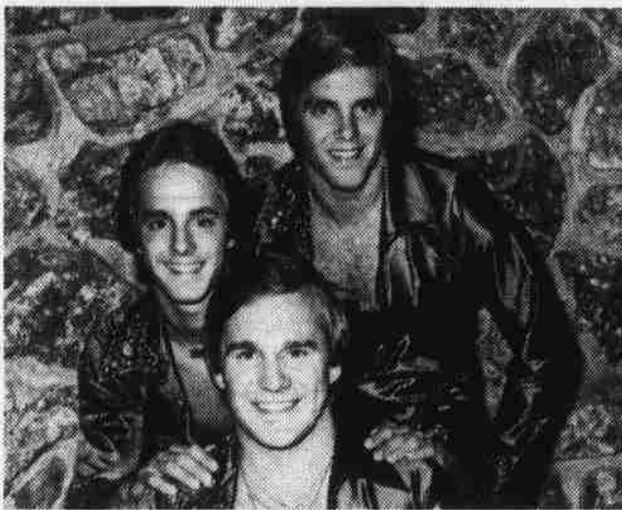
the threats of cults, anti-semitism, and the moral majority, with support of Public Education as a priority.
