JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

JERUSALEM, Israel: - Jerusalem's Plaza Hotel this month became the first hotel anywhere in the world (outside the United States) to broadcast American television news to its guests on a 24 - hour basis. The Jerusalem Plaza Hotel is a member of the International Canadian Pacific hotel chain - and is located in central Jerusalem.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- A 22-year-old Is-raeli woman was reported "in serious condition" after undergoing brain surgery at Hadassah Hospital for head injuries caused by a rock thrown through the windshield of a military vehicle she was riding in on the night of January 29. The victim, Esther Ohana of Beit Shaen, was hit when the vehicle, driven by a senior army officer, was passing through the Dahariya Village on the Beersheba - Hebron highway. The rock was thrown from behind the wall of a nearby school. The army clamped a curfew on the village and 10 suspects were arrested for questioning.

WASHINGTON (WNS) -- A Justice Department official has admitted that a second country has turned down a U.S. request for permanent residence for Rumanian Orthodox Archbishop Valerian Trifa of Grass Lake, Michigan. Kathleen Coleman, the Justice Depart-ment attorney, who presented the government's case during Trifa's deportation hearings in Detroit, said that Italy had joined Switzerland in turning down the U.S. request to take Trifa. Coleman said the U.S. will continue to work to find a home for Trifa.

BONN (WNS) -- Karl-Heinz Hoffman, who headed a group of West German rightwing extremists who received military training in PLO installations in Lebanon, was charged in Nuremberg with the murder of Jewish pub-lisher Shlomo Levin and his companion, Frida Poescke, in Erlangen on December 19, 1980. Hoffman was the leader of the so-called sports group named after him and which was outlawed by the Interior Ministry in 1980. Some 15 members of the group, led by Hoffman personally, later turned up in PLO military camps where they trained in the use of arms.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- The direct cost of the Lebanon war, projected through the end of March this year, will be 48.2 billion Shekels (equal at present rate to \$1.35 billion), the army has announced. The army said this figure goes not include any indirect costs such as the impact of the call - up of the reserves. The largest single expense was 23.6 billion Shekels (663 million) on expended equipment and the replacement of stockpiles and the return to service of material.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Two Katyusha rockets launched from Lebanon fell inside Israel near the border kibbutz of Zarit. An army spokesman said there were no casualties or damage. Army patrols are searching for the launchers and persons who fired the rockets. This is the third time rockets have fallen on Israel territory since the war in Lebanon began last June. Premier Menachem Begin promised at that time that no more Katyusha rockets would ever fall on Israel.
