Why Hussein Might Join Peace Talks

King Hussein of Jordan has allegedly agreed to join the peace process possibly as early as next month, according to reports both in Washington and the Middle East.

The most complete account of the purported agreement between President Reagan and the King appeared in the Kuwaiti daily, Al Qabas, an Israeli newspaper, earlier this month.

This account, which quoted Jordanian sources, states that the U.S. pledged to deliver 97% of the West Bank and Gaza to Jordan, while 3%, essential for Israeli security, would remain in Israeli hands. Accordingly, there would be demographic readjustment. Villages divided since 1948 would be reunited -- half of them going to Israel, half to Jordan.

According to the paper, President Reagan warned Hussein during his visit to Washington in December that if he did not join the peace process now, further diplomatic efforts would have to be deferred until 1986 because the third and fourth years of any American president's term is taken up with politics.

The President is reported to have told Hussein that the U.S. was committed to returning the Golan Heights to Syria but opposed Syrian participation in any peace negotiations -- that would give the Soviets a role in the process.

The report does not disclose how the United States will achieve Israeli withdrawal from these territories.

The Israeli press also reports an imminent Jordanian move. However, Israeli political sources say that Hussein will not take action until after Egyptian President Hosni Mubarak and Prime Minister Begin visit the United States (Mubarak just finished his trip and Begin possibly in February).

Israeli Foreign Minister Yitzhak Shamir told an Israeli interviewer that he expects Hussein to announce that he will join the peace process "in principle." But the Foreign Minister added, "It is a question of psychological warfare. Hussein is trying to seize the opportunity known as the 'Reagan Plan' to arrive at an Israeli withdrawal from the territories of Judea, Samaria and the Gaza Strip even before the election campaign in the United States."

Hussein, he maintained, was not trying to achieve peace, but to take back the territories.

Details of a reported secret agreement between President Reagan and King Hussein of Jordan continue to surface. The latest comes in Yoman Hashavu'a, a Likud newspaper, in an article by Moshe Yahalom.

He writes that "the White House has promised to return to Jordan 100% of the lands of Judea and Samaria -- 97% directly, and 3% in land exchanges...." Hussein would get East Jerusalem and the Latrum enclave.
