commission studying the massacre.

"It certainly was not my intention to cast aspersions on people of the Jewish faith any more than running cartoons depicting Muammar Khadafy as a madman indict all Libyans, or those comparing Richard Nixon with crooks are indicative of all Americans. I felt the illustration, simply, was making a comment about a government leader."

What was missing in the R-J's running of the cartoon was, in a word, sensitivity. With the license of free comment as we enjoy it in this country goes a responsibility that it should be kept within reasonable bounds of good taste and judgment. There are no rulebooks that say what is good taste or good judgment and individual opinions may vary widely.

In this instance, we should have kept in mind that the issue was terribly tender, that the Holocaust was so vile, so enormous, it left an entire people with nerves raw to any suggestion that it could be compared to lesser political issues. With that in mind, the Benson cartoon went beyond the bounds of good taste.

It shouldn't have run in the Review-Journal. The cartoon was not the view of the Review-Journal. A statement published each day beneath the editorial makes it clear that other opinions on the two editorial pages are those of the author or artist indicated.

But that does not mean we can be casual in selecting material for those pages. We will be more sensitive in the future.

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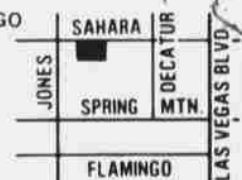
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
