

MOSHE ARENS AGREES TO SERVE

Labor Alignment said it would take a "wait and see" approach toward Arens, indicating it would not block his confirmation by the Knesset. Begin's coalition partner, the ultra right wing Tehiya which fiercely opposed the ouster of Sharon, indicated satisfaction with the choice of Arens.

The 58 - year - old Lithuanian born diplomat who studied aeronautical engineering in the U.S. and chaired the Knesset's Foreign Affairs

and Security Committee before he was posted to Washington, is a Herut hardliner. He does not have the brash and abrasive character of Sharon and earned a good reputation as Israel's envoy in Washington. Even Labor critics of the government concede that his appointment will introduce "a saner atmosphere" in the Cabinet. But Arens is no less hawkish than the flamboyant general he will replace at the Defense ministry. As a Knesset member, he voted against the Camp David accords in 1978 and against the peace treaty with Egypt in 1979. But he has since indicated that he regards Camp David as a fait accompli and could serve within its framework.

Meanwhile, Sharon took formal leave of the Defense Ministry with full pomp and military ceremony. The media was present in force and some army officers and officials attending the proceedings expressed surprise at the extensive public arrangements made for what is normally a quiet event attended mainly by the staff of the outgoing minister. Sharon nevertheless used the occasion to defend his policies during his 19 - month tenure as Defense Minister. He said he had been determined to head a powerful deterrent force which he could not hesitate to use under certain circumstances.

The circumstances he enumerated were the deployment of Iraqi troops in Jordan; an Egyptian violation of the military clauses of the peace treaty which, he said, would trigger Israel's reoccupation of Sinai; or the presence of nuclear weapons in enemy hands. He added, however, that he was not sure such a strong policy of deterrence was still possible, given the prevailing atmosphere in the country. This was an oblique reference to what Sharon perceives to be the influence of doveish elements in the army and in the country as a whole.

Camp Ramah in California is pleased to announce the start of the Tikvah (Hope) Program, a summer camp program for Jewish children, ages ten to thirteen, with learning disabilities, emotional disorders, and mild mental retardation. The Tikvah Program is the first of its kind on the West Coast and will serve approximately five thousand Jewish children with special learning needs in the Pacific region. Previously, these children had been excluded from Jewish summer camp program.

Tikvah campers will live together in separate cabins and will be integrated into the regular Ramah Program as much as possible. Specially trained counselors

will insure that their special needs are met. While they learn about Judaism by observing the rituals daily, they will also develop friendships and learn how to live in a group situation. The results of such a program, as shown through the experiences of families who participated in the Wisconsin and Massachusetts Tikvah Programs, are often a dramatic change in a child's self-image and involvement in Judaism.

David Ackerman, long time Ramahnik and doctoral student in Special Education at UCLA will develop and direct the Tikvah Program. Sandy Gordon, a professional active in developing programs for children with special needs and a parent of a child with learning disabilities is chairperson of the Tikvah Advisory Board.

TWO ISRAELI SOLDIERS KILLED IN AMBUSH ATTACK IN LEBANON

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Two Israeli soldiers were killed and two were slightly wounded in an ambush attack in the central sector of Lebanon. It was the second attack in two days against Israeli troops in Lebanon by terrorists riding in private cars.

An army spokesman said the incident occurred in the area of Al-Zahlata, one of the northernmost points patrolled by Israeli soldiers, when

a jeep and a command car passed a civilian vehicle parked at the side of the road. The vehicle appeared to have broken down.

In a related development, the Yesh Gvul (There's a Limit), movement told a press conference here February 16 that 21 Israeli soldiers had been sentenced to prison by military courts since the Lebanon war started, for refusing to serve in Lebanon.
