



The Simon Wiesenthal Center hosted the Los Angeles Premiere of its Academy Award - winning

documentary on the Holocaust, "Geno-Holocaust, cide," on January 31, 1983. The Los Angeles

Premiere of the unique, multi - image narrated by film Elizabeth Taylor and Orson Wells, coincided almost to the day (January 30, 1933) with the 50year anniversary of Adolf Hitler's rise to power in what was to become the Third regime Reich, a universally condemned for the brutal murder and torture of millions of men. women and children.

The Premier brought together a number of distinguished guests, including actor Karl Malden and his wife, Mona, and and Shirlee Fonda, Tom Hayden, Red Buttons, Norman and Karen Fell, Marilyn Hall and Sidney Sheinberg (President of MCA).

"Genocide," COproduced by Director Arnold Schwartzman and the Simon Center, Wiesenthal tells the story of the Holocaust through original footage with historical narration by Orson Welles, and actual stories of some of the innocent victims of Hitler's "final solution," nar-
