SHCHARANSKY ENDS HUNGER STRIKE

NEW YORK (WNS)
-- Imprisoned Soviet Jewish activist Anatoly Shcharansky, currently completing the fifth year of a 13year sentence at the notorious Chistopol Prison, has ended his nearly five - month hunger strike to protest the denial of mail and visits from members of his family, privileges allowed to other prisoners, the Student Struggle Soviet Jewry (SSSJ) and the Union of Councils of Soviet Jews (UCSJ) confirmed here February

According to the SSSJ and the UCSJ, this information was revealed in a letter Shcharansky wrote, dated February 7 and received February 15 by his mother, Ida Milgrom, in Moscow, that he had resumed eating on January 14. Since then, the letter


