LEBANON - ISRAEL TALKS CONTINUE

REAGAN ADMINISTRATION CONCERNED OVER SOVIET MISSLES IN SYRIA

WASH. (WNS) -- Secretary of State George Shultz termed the deployment of Soviet manned SAM-5 long range surface-to-air missiles in Syria a "sombering and destabilizing" development while Secretary of Defense Caspar Weinberger said the deployment of the missiles has made Syria "an outpost of the Soviet empire."

Both views, expressed by the Administration officials in separate speaking appearances underlined the seriousness with which the Administration views the recent deployment of the missiles. The missiles have a range of 180 miles and places them within striking distance of northern Israel and U.S. aircraft in the Mediterranean.

Shultz said the deployment of the missiles in Syria demonstrates the need to advance the negotiations for the withdrawal of all foreign forces from Lebanon. Speaking before the Senate Foreign Operations Subcommittee, Shultz said "there

LITTLE PROGRESS REPORTED

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Israeli - Lebanese - U.S. negotiators continued their 19th and 20th rounds of talks with little progress reported leading to the withdrawal of foreign forces and agreements on security and normalization arrangements between Lebanon and Israel.

At the 19th round of talks held in Khalde, there were reports of angry confrontations between the chief of the Lebanese delegation, Antoine Fatale, and his Israel counterpart, David Kimche, after Kimche made it clear that Israel has not changed its position in response to new offers to Lebanon. A spokesman for the Lebanese delegation accused Israel of "intransigence" on grounds that it is not prepared to accept Lebanon's compromise proposals for mutual relations and security arrangements.

Lebanon's proposals were conveyed to the Israeli leadership by U.S. Ambassador Philip Habib. Israeli sources said they would be considered by the ministerial steering committee on the Lebanese negotiations. The difference between the sides on security arrangements in south Lebanon were said to be over details but were "basic" with respect to the normalization of relations.

At the conclusion of the 20th round of talks, a spokesman for the Israeli delegation, Avi Pazner stressed that whatever agreements are reached, all points must be put down in writing. A spokesman for the Lebanese delegation said that his delegation is, for the first time, optimistic over the chances of reaching an agreement. He said that Lebanon might agree to allow Israeli forces to enter south Lebanon for periodic inspection tours after the Israeli Army has withdrawn. The inspection tours apparently would be conducted jointly with the Lebanese Army.
