NEO-NAZI TERRORISTS ARRESTED

PARIS (WNS) -- Five German neo-Nazi terrorists arrested in West Germany and Britain are currently under investigation by French authorities who believe the suspects may be involved in the attack on Jo Goldenberg's restaurant in the old Jewish quarter here last August and in earlier anti-Semitic attacks in Vienna, Berlin and London. A sixthmember of the gang is being sought. They being sought. may also have been involved in the attack on a Brussels synagogue last summer and in the machinegun and grenade attack last October in which a two year old child was killed and a number of persons wounded.

The terrorist gang was rounded up as a result of cooperation between French, West German and British police. Three ar-rested in Frankfort on February 15 are Dieter Sporleder, 22, Hans - Peter Frass, 22; and Helga Blashe, 40. Police foundarms and explosives in their hideout. Two other suspects, Walter Ke-xel and Ulrich Tillman, were arrested in Poole, England, on February 18 and were presented before a London magistrate on February 21 for extradition proceedings. Frass, Kexel and Tillman are believed by German to have authorities been members of the outlawed neo-Nazi paramilitary organization that posed as

sports club headed by Karl Heinz Hoffmann. Hoffman has been charged with the murder of an Israeli publisher, Shlomo Le-vin, and his woman companion, Frida Poescke in West Germany in 1980, and was arrested several months ago.

French police said February 21 that Kexel and Odfried Hepp, another neo-Hepp, Nazi suspect detained in Frankfurt, were at the Goldenberg restaurant when a terrorist hit squad killed six people and wound-ed 22. French police close to the investigation however remain skeptical that the attack was carried out by neo-Nazis. A senior police official has been quoted as saying that undisclosed evidence and other leading leads point to a "Palestinian" connection." There is a belief that the neo-Nazis, while not committing the actual attack on the Paris restaurant, had provided arms and logistics to the hit squad. Reports also said that some of the terrorists arrested had visited Lebanon on occasions several and were in the West the
