

LOCAL LEADERS CONVENE IN TULSA

Local Jewish communal leaders will attend a JWB Southwest Inter - Center Board Institute on March 18 - 20, 1983, at the Tulsa Jewish Community Center.

Officers, Board members, and executives of JWB-affiliated Jewish Community Centers and other leaders in 11 Southwest communities will discuss urgent Jewish community issues and needs and the responsibility and role of the JCC in meeting those needs.

Gerald B. Bubis, director, School of Jewish Communal

Service, HUC-JIR, Los Angeles, will be Scholar - in - Residence throughout the JWB Institute.

Professor Bubis will speak at the opening session Friday, March 18, on "The JCC - An Instrument for Building a Sense of Jewish Community." He will also deliver a Shabbat shiur on "Coalition Building to Strengthen the Jewish Community."

JWB Training Consultant Howard Wasserman will lead a discussion on "Leadership Development - Continuing Motivation and Involvement

of Lay Leaders."

Workshops will be held on "Strengthening the Jewish Family"; "Serving Children and Youth"; "Serving Older Adults"; "Financing the JCC"; "New Emphases in H & PE: Rehabilitation and Prevention"; "Day Care Programs and Services"; "Strategic Planning for the Future"; "Jewish Mobility: Impact on JCCs"; and "Recruiting and Retaining Professional Personnel."

Sheila Mudd of Tulsa, Okla, is chairperson of the planning committee. Arthur Brodtkin and Howard Wasserman are JWB staff consultants for the Institute.

Participating communities are Albuquerque, N. Mex.; Austin, Tex.; Little Rock, Ark.; Las Vegas, Nev.; Corpus Christi, Tex.; Fort Worth, Tex.; El Paso, Tex.; San Antonio, Tex.; Tulsa, Okla.; Oklahoma City, and Shreveport, La.

JWB is the network of and the central service agency for Jewish Community Centers, YM & YWHAs and camps in the U.S. and Canada serving one million Jews. It enhances the quality of Jewish life in North America through the Jewish Media Service, JWB Lecture Bureau, Jewish Book Council, Jewish Music Council, and Israel - related programs.

SUMMER TOUR IN ISRAEL

A variety of summer touring opportunities especially geared to the interests of high school and college - age students is being offered by the American Zionist Youth Foundation Israel Program Center.

For high school students, the AZYF is sponsoring Israel Summer Happening, 40 days of travel designed to provide a stimulating, in-depth introduction to Israel. The itinerary includes touring in Jerusalem, Galilee, the Negev and Tel Aviv. Students will participate in seminars, experience a nature study center, and camp in tents in the Galilee.

The Israel Graduate Summer Happening is a similar tour for students who will graduate from high school in the spring of 1983 with extra activities geared to students who are entering college in the fall.

Departure dates for the high school group are June 29, July 6, and July 7; for the graduates, July 7. The cost is \$1,960.

The College Sum-

mer Program is designed to provide college - age students with an in - depth perspective of Israel and a better understanding of the endurance

of the Jewish people throughout history. Included in the 40-day itinerary are intensive tours of

Jerusalem, the Galilee, the Negev and Tel Aviv, and participation in seminars and a stay at a nature study center. Departure dates are June 15, 22, and 29; cost is \$1,960.

For college students with limited time, the Student August Tour is a three - week introduction to Israel which yields insights into the vitality and spirit of the country. Departure is August 1, and the cost is \$1,490.
