There will be 85 merchants in all. The Farmers Market will be infusing hundreds of new jobs into the sagging Las Vegas economy.

A.V.A. INVESTMENTS, INC., the developers, are confident that their Farmers Market project will not only revitalize the Commercial Center, but will be a mecca for the locals and tourists

made in the effort to gain the withdrawal of the foreign forces. Administration An official, briefing re-porters here, said that when the two special U.S. envoys -and Philip Habib Morris Draper -- re-Middle turn to the East to continue the negotiations, which have been progressing slowly for some ll weeks, they will go "back to a negotiating environment that is ... positively altered" as a result of the talks in Washington.

Shamir, who had five separate sessions with Secretary of State George Shultz and met for 30 minutes with President Reagan indicated that whether or not progress was achieved would become apparent soon when the parties return to the negotiating table. He said "some new ideas have emerged" which he was taking back to Jerusalem "with the conviction that we are nearer" to a solution. Salem and Shamir met separately with Shultz. said the Salem "people in the Middle East are tired of war. They are ready for a civilized existence, and there is a leadership in the Arabworld that is now ready and determined to secure peace, Salem asserted that "If we succeed in having peace in Lebanon, I think that peace in the Middle East is possible in the not too distant future." The negotiations have apparently been

allowed over Israel's demands for security arrangements to protect Israel's northern border from future terrorist attacks and seeks an agreement with Lebanon on some

Shamir emphasized. that the major purpose of his visit to the U.S., which was extended by one - day for more consultations with the Administration, was to explain Israel's position to the Americans and to seek what he termed a coordinated policy between Israel and the U.S.

Meanwhile, there was little indiciation of what kind of agreement will be worked out in an effort to ensure the security of northern Israel and southern Lebanon, Reports of the proposals here suggest that the expansion of the U.S. Marines to southern Lebanon in conjunction with other troops in the multinational force currently in the Berrut area, would only be decided upon after the shape of security arrangement is worked in.

The reports of the proposals being made by the U.S. include giving the Lebanese army responsibility patrolling the for areas near the Israeli border with Maj. Saad Haddad's Christian militia being absorbed into the regular Lebanese army. The MNF. would expand outside of the Beirut area to prevent infiltration, principally from Syria, into south Lebanon. The Administration officials, in briefing reporters, suggested that the United Nations Interim Force in Lebanon (UNIFIL) might be stationed near Palestinian refugee camps to give the residents there a feeling of security while the Lebanese army would have the actual responsibility for security.
