The World Jewish Congress has formally raised before the UN Human Rights Commission the worldwide anti-Semitic terror attacks of recent month.

The WJC delegate at the Commission, Mr. Robin Gilbert of Geneva, spoke on the increasing manifestation of religious bigotry and discrimination around the world. Dismissing claims that anti-Jewish terror attacks were political in nature, he asked: "What more deliberateanti-Jewish and antireligious action can there be than bomb-


