BILL TO AMEND LAW OF RETURN DEFEATED

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- The Knesset, by a vote of 58 - 50, defeated a bill to amend the Law of Return to recognize converts to Judaism only persons converted according to Halacha, religious law as administered by Orthodox rabbis. The Liberal Party faction of Likud joined the Labor opposition in rejecting the measure which had the support of Premier Menachem Begin. Action on the bill, which was the source of bitter controversy for years, was pressed by the Agudat Israel Party, a member of

the coalition of Begin's government. Although Begin promised he would do all he could _ensure passage, Liberal Party MKs were released from party discipline and allowed to vote freely on the issue. According to a report, six
