
## ONE-DAY ARCHAEOLOGY DIGS ATTRACT ISRAEL BOUND TRAVELERS

LYON, France --Persons throughout the world who wish to testify or bring evidence against former official Klaus Nazi have been Barbie asked to contact the Coordinating Committee of Jewish Communities and Organizations in Lyon.

Dr. Marc Aron, general secretary of B'nai B'rith District (Western Europe), announced that the Coordinating Committee, with which B'nai B'rith is cooperating, will participate in Barbie's trial "in the name of all the victims, indirect," direct or

of the Nazi regime in the Lyon region.

The committee, added. Dr. Aron will offer "all material and legal assis-tance" to those desirous of testifying or who have evidence of Nazi barbarism during the German occupation of France. into negotiations with Israel now.

Israel has a legitimate interest in a stable Lebanon and in the ability of the Lebanese government to prevent terrorist activity from within Lebanon directed against Israel. There cannot be a stable government in Lebanon as long as PLO and Syrian forces remain within its borders. Israel cannot be expected to with-draw its forces from Lebanon except in conjunction with a total withdrawal from the country of all PLO and Syrian forces and the establishment of the necessary safeguards to assure that southern Lebanon will not again become a staging area for terrorist attacks against Israel,

Israel and Lebanon have neither territorial claims against each other nor other outstanding disputes. Therefore, the withdrawal of Israeli forces from Lebanon should be accompanied by the establishment of normal economic, cultural and other relations between the two nations. As recognized at Camp David, security is enhanced by the relationship of peace and cooperation between nations which enjoy normal relations.

The primary requisite for peace in the Middle East is that Israel's neighbors recognize the sovereign legitimacy of Israel and the benefits to be derived from a full peace. We urge them -- particularly Jordan -- to heed President Reagan's call of September I to "accept the reality of Israel, and the reality that peace and justice are to be gained only through hard, fair and direct negotiations."
