

REAGAN'S DECISION TO HOLD UP F-16'S ANGERS ISRAELI OFFICIALS

- Israeli here were shaprlycritical of an assertion by President Reagan that he will not approve the scheduled delivery of 75 F-16 jet fighters to Israel until Israel withdraws its forces from Lebanon where the Israelis are "in the position of occupying another country. Reagan said the U.S. is "forbidden by law" to ship the planes to Israel, but he did not say whether Israelhad violated the terms of its arms sales agreements with the U.S. under which American weapons can be used only for defensive purposes.

Nevertheless, Is-raeli Foreign Minis-ter Yitzhak Shamir said the President's remarks were "very regrettable." Shamir maintained that the U.S. knows "very well that we entered Lebason to defend ourselves from the murderous attacks of the Palestinian terrorists who were using Lebanon as their base," An unidentified Foreign Ministry official called Reagan's

JERUSALEM (WNS) statement "most un-- Israeli officials fortunate" because "the notion that our forces are in occupation is erroneous beour action cause against the Palestine Liberation Organiza tion was an act of legitimate self de-

fense," In Washington, State Department spokes-man Alan Romberg stressed to reporters that the President's remarks did not mean he has determined that Israel's operations into Lebanon violated the law of the arms agreement between the two countries. He added, however, that while Israeli forces remain in Lebanon "concerns arise as to whether it will be consistent with the spirit of the law" to go ahead with the delivery of the aircraft.

Reagan's action is not without precedent. After Israel bombed Iraq's nuclear reactor in 1981, the President held up delivery of 14 F-16s and two F-15s, informing Congress that Israel might have violated the arms sales agreements. In June 1982, when Israel invaded Lebanon and conducted Jaily bombing raids on Beirut, the Administration held up the delivery of 75 F-16s which are now at issue, The aircraft had been promised to Israel in 1978 to conpensate for U.S. weapons sales to Egypt, Jordan and Saudi Arabia. The Administration has since refrained from giving Congress formal notification of the sale, as required by law before the planes can be delivered. The planes are due for delivery in 1935, and there was no indicution whener the delay in formal notification of Congress will have any effect on the delivery date.
